(Canadian Press Despatch)
Ottawa, Jan. 5.—Returned soldiers today continued their complaints against the transport Northland, before Commissioner Hodgins. Private John Blackmore declared he had seen a soldier take a maggot out of the soup served to him by Northland stewards and he himself had been served with a piece of bone instead of meat. Other complaints sworn to today were that the latrines overflowed many gallons of filthy water into the soldiers' sleeping quarters.
