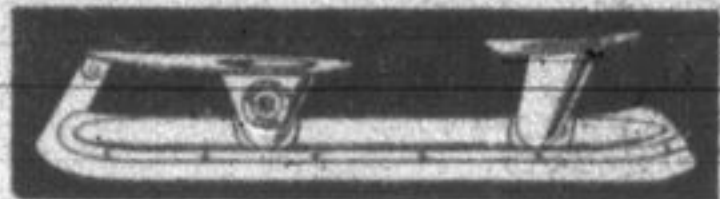

### SPORT IN THE MOVIES

All Branches Except Boxing to be Seen on Screen.

Within two months sports will be boosted in every moving picture theatre in the United States. In Springfield, Ill., articles of incorporation have been filed for the Athletic Film Corporation of Chicago, and the company plans to release one and probably two reels of film every month showing well known players participating in their respective branches of sport.

The first reel is completed and will probably be released next month. If the objects of the promoters are realized they plan to take pictures of all sporting events where titles are at stake, with the exception of ring contests. No boxing pictures will be taken, as there is a nation-wide law prohibiting them being shown on the screens in this country.

Mary McHale, the former American League pitcher, recently sponsored a set of baseball pictures showing the members of the major league teams in action on the diamond. They were shown at several Broadway houses and scored a great success.

### Fulton Is Unpopular

Fred Fulton is fast becoming unpopular with the fight fans and promoters of the sport in San Francisco. Fred went out there a few weeks ago and has engaged in several bouts and one of his recent engagements was a victory over K.O. Krivosky, a Frisco heavyweight. A few minutes before he entered the ring with Krivosky, Fred got into a jam with the promoters of the match and threatened to call the show off if he did not have his way.

### Irish Referee's Troubles.

In consequence of the recent attacks made on them while officiating matches in Belfast, the referees who were engaged at these matches have unanimously resolved to make strong representations to the Council of the Irish League with the object of remedying such a state of affairs. The resolution states that if any referee is again molested all the union officials will withdraw their services from the senior matches. The referees have also sent forward an application for an immediate increase in their fees from 15s to one guinea per match.

### Pay English Players.

At a special meeting of the English Football League, it was decided to continue the war regulations of the Football Association with regard to players' payments, subject to an allowance of \$5 a week for players taking part in league games or attending in reserve, the rule to come into force at once. It was also agreed to defer the consideration of the question of players working in their spare time. Two inter-league games with Scotland will be arranged in the new year, half the proceeds to go to the football national war fund.

### Tigers or Not at All.

Frank J. Navin, president of the Detroit club in the American League, is quoted as saying that "Tex Cobb would be with the Tigers next season or not at all." This would seem to end the talk going about that Cobb would be seen in the uniform of the New York Yankees when the players get out on the diamond.

### To Tax Racing Associations

Racing associations which enjoyed a prosperous season last year will be hard hit by the new U.S. Federal Revenue Bill, according to expert accountants. That some of them may have to pay a tax approximating \$100,000 is declared to be not improbable.

Provisions of the pending bill will apply to racing associations in Maryland, Kentucky and Louisiana, as well as New York State, and it was estimated that half a million dollars will scarcely cover the total amount of their contribution to the Treasury. Racing at fairs is not subject to the tax.

### To Return to Ring.

Georges Carpentier, European heavyweight champion, will be demobilized from the French army with his class, probably late in April or the following month. The French pugilist is understood to be eager to return to the ring and has practically completed arrangements for two matches. One will be fought at Strasbourg in July and the other in London in October, according to present plans. Bombardier Wells, the English heavyweight, is expected to be Carpentier's opponent in one battle.

### Must Stick to Agreement

Though the owners of the St. Louis National League club are quite willing to allow Jack Hendricks to take his release and manage the Indianapolis club, Jack says his contract has another season to run with St. Louis and will insist that the Cardinals live up to their agreement.

### Ladies and Hockey.

Ladies' hockey appears to be gaining in favor. In the east there are a number of teams, while Toronto also boasts of several. The Alerts Ladies' Hockey Club of Ottawa, has received a challenge from Banff Springs, Alta., asking for a series of games for the championship of Canada.

### Another Veteran Passes.

Thomas Faron, who 50 years ago was stroke of the famous old Vesper four of New York, died yesterday at his home in Yonkers, N.Y., at the age of 77 years. For many years he was coach of the Columbia University crews.

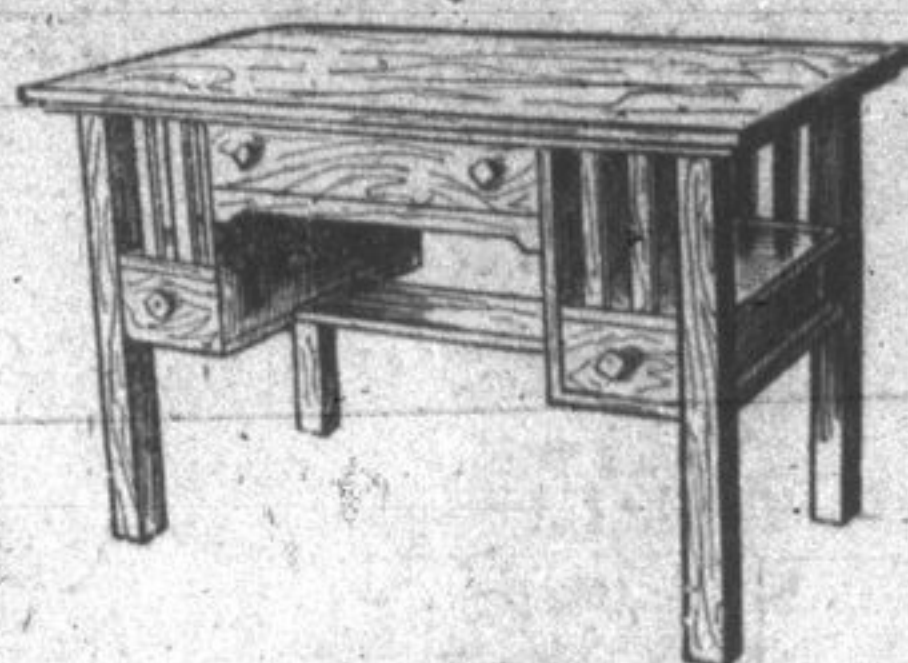
