A CASE IN COURT

OVER A BURIAL BILL

Royal Military College Commandant to be Made Party For Cause.

A busy session of the Division Court was held at the court house on Tuesday, when a long docket of cases was up for disposal. The court lasted from nine o'clock until three in the afternoon. Twenty-six suits for payments of debts and claims were up for trial, and fourteen judgment summonses were issued. A number of cases were adjourned for various reasons.

An interesting case was one in which M. P. Keyes, undertaker, sued Mrs. George Anson, for payment of the expenses of her husband's funeral. In evidence the defendant stated that when her husband, who was for over twenty years a servant of the Royal Military College, died, the college authorities undertook to pay the funeral expenses. The finding of the court was that the clerk of the court was ordered to make Brig.-Gen. C. N. Ferriss, commandant of the Royal Military College, a party to the cause.

FIRST CANADIAN BAND MASTER IN GERMANY

William J. Christmas, Kingston, Led Band Playing "Maple Leaf Forever."

Leading his band, playing "The Maple Leaf Forever" and "O Canada," Sergt. William J. Christmas, former bandmaster of the Salvation Army in Kingston, had the honor of being the first Canadian bandmaster to enter Germany. He and his band were just received in the city from Mr. Christmas, in which he refers to the incident. He says that he is very glad the struggle is all over, and he will be greatly pleased when he gets the chance to get home again among his friends.

Bandmaster Christmas went overseas with the 59th Battalion, and at the present time is bandmaster of the 2nd Battalion.

REDUCED TO FIFTEEN

Number of Dominion Police Under J. J. Graham.

J. J. Graham of the Dominion Police Force, when spoken to regarding the appointment of men on the force, stated that up to November last he had seventy-five employed, but the number has been reduced to fifteen by the suspension of the Military Service Act. These men are employed throughout Eastern Ontario, and are not located at any particular place for any great length of time. The men who are now with him in the city will only be here a short time and will accompany him to another part of his district. It would be manifestly unreasonable, he said, to ask local citizens to give up their regular work for temporary work, but if there are any men desirous of taking up police duties they should address their applications to the Chief Commissioner of Police, Department of Justice, Ottawa.

There are openings for active young men on the North-west Mounted Police as the force is being increased to its original strength. In Eastern Canada only a limited number of men will ever be employed, owing to settled conditions and the employment of municipal police.

Children's Aid Society.

A meeting of the Children's Aid Society was held on Tuesday afternoon. Dr. A. W. Richardson occupied the chair. Inspector John Folio presented his monthly report, which was highly satisfactory. All complaints that were received were thoroughly investigated, and the action taken by the inspector was approved. He exhibited the photograph of a beautiful child that was a ward of the society, and now in the care of adopted parents living in Chicago, which showed that it was the idol of its new home. The secretary was instructed to issue a cheque to a former ward (now married) for the balance of the money paid to her credit on the society's books.
