REDEMPTORIST COLLEGE
To Be Erected at Brockville At Cost of \$350,000.

Toronto, Jan. 16.—No more Catholics entering the Redemptorist order of the Roman Catholic Church will have to obtain their education in the United States. There are at the present time over 200 Canadians studying in various colleges of the order in the United States. The Dominion of Canada created a province of the Redemptorist order some two months ago, under Rev. Father T. J. Mulhall.

Last night at a largely-attended meeting of the Holy Name Society in St. Patrick's hall, Father Mulhall started a campaign to raise \$750,000 in the Dominion for the establishment of a college, novitiate and seminary for the education of boys and men for the priesthood.

Work is now being commenced on the college which will be located at Brockville, and which will cost approximately \$350,000. Two other sites are under consideration for the proposed seminary and novitiate.

IRELAND'S DELEGATES
To The Peace Conference Suggested By Sinn Fein.

(Canadian Press Despatch)
Dublin, Jan. 16.—The Sinn Fein organization at a meeting yesterday announced that at a conference of Irish republican members of the British parliament on Tuesday drafts of the declaration of independence and of a message to the nations of the world were considered. Both matters were referred with amendments to committees for final revision.

It was decided to summon an all-Irish conference under the patronage of the national assembly at an early date. The meeting decided to recommend to all Irish conferences the sending of Professor DeValera, Arthur Griffiths and Count Plunkett as Ireland's delegates to the peace conference.

Marital Law For Republic, Buenos Aires, Jan. 14.—The Chamber of Deputies by a vote of 62 to 5 declared marital law throughout the entire republic for thirty days. The bill is expected to pass the senate and to receive the signature of the president. The measure will become effective immediately. Crowds outside the newspaper offices cheered the posting of the bulletin.

The revolutionist forces at Santarem, northwest of Lisbon, having refused to surrender, the Government troops have surrounded the town and commenced a bombardment.

The British troopship Empress of Asia passed through the Panama Canal yesterday en route to Vancouver with 1,400 discharged soldiers.
