TO MERGE ALL RACE TRACKS IN KENTUCKY Churchill Downs to Close, and Derby to Be Run at Douglas Park.

The proposed sale of the stock of the Douglas Park and Latonia tracks to an underwriting syndicate, which has been pending for some time, appears to be nearing consummation, and will cause a merger of all the tracks in operation in Kentucky, including Churchill Downs and the Kentucky Association in Lexington.

It has been the desire of the prime movers in the plan, which originated with James P. Ross, superintendent of the Kentucky Association, and who interested Edward F. Sims in the enterprise, to have Douglas Park take over the management of Churchill Downs, with a view of closing the Downs course.

The delay in closing the deal has been caused by the failure on the part of those in charge of the Downs to accept this proposition. But now there appears to be every probability that Charles F. Grainger, Pat. J. Hanlon, Matt Wimp and Hamilton C. Applegate, as well as others in control of the Louisville Jockey Club will agree to the proposed plan of merging all the tracks under one management in the form of a board of officials similar to those which control the affairs of the jockey clubs in England and France, the Argentine Republic and New York.

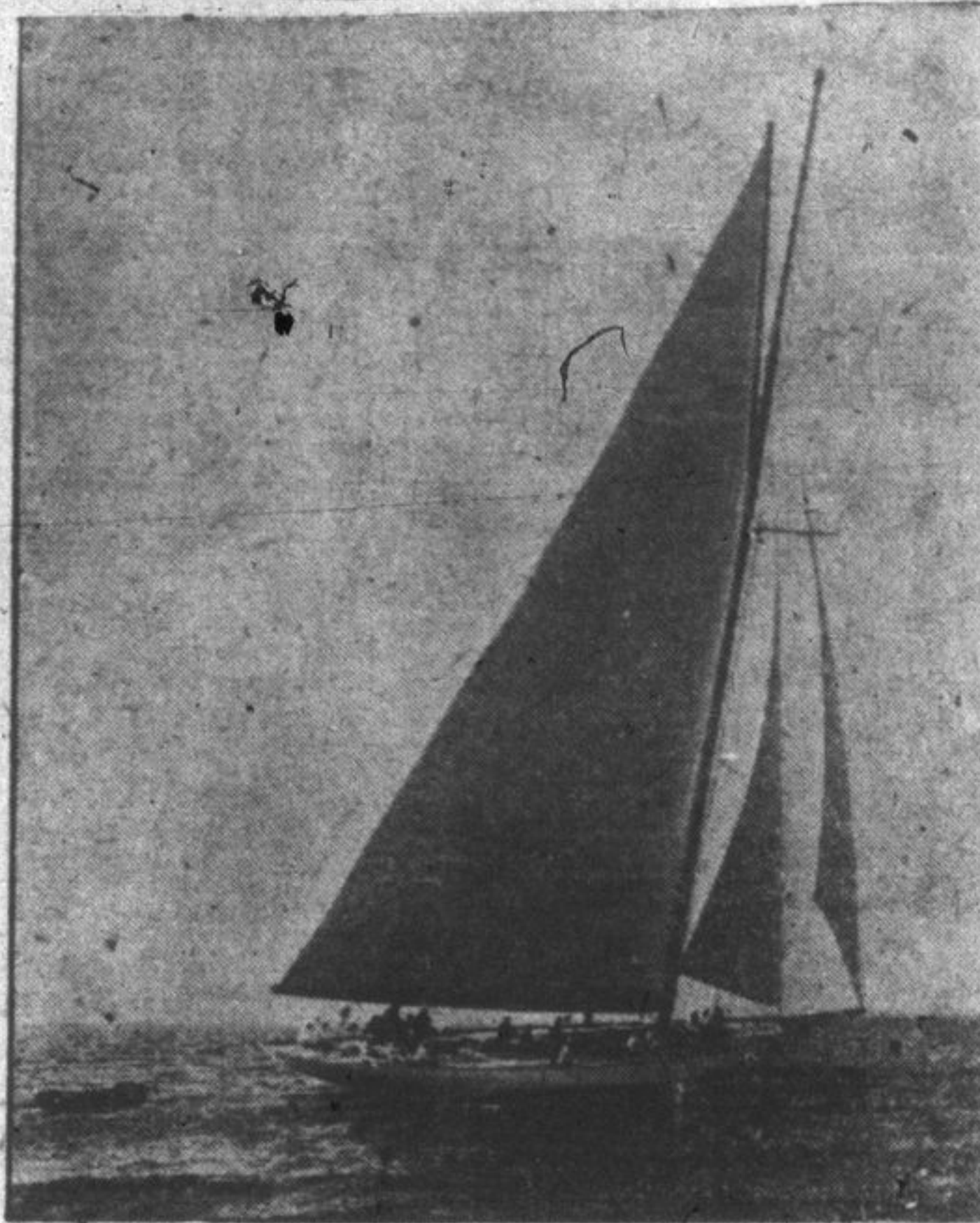
Such arrangement would be eminently satisfactory to the breeders and horsemen in Kentucky. It would bring together the various factions and result in placing the racing situation in the hands of men well qualified to maintain the sport of racing on the highest plane.

It will also go well toward preventing a move in the next legislature to enact laws curtailing the present privilege of racing associations.

Resumption of Races. The cabinet at Ottawa has been asked by the racing and breeding interests to lift the suspension on racing accompanied by speculation. The suspension last season was due to an order in Council prohibiting the operation of the pari-mutuels or other methods of betting for the duration of the war and for six months thereafter.

According to a despatch from Ottawa, the Cabinet is engaged in reviewing, with others, that order which has to do with racing. As a matter of official record the war is not over, but the racing and breeding interests feel that the purpose of the order has been served and desire to be permitted to resume their activities next spring under the conditions which obtained before and during part of the war.

Wild in Great Demand

Despite his defeat by Pat Moore, the American featherweight, Jimmy Wilde is in greater demand than ever. In addition to the prospects of another encounter with Moore and his arranged match with Johnny Erle to take place in New York some time in April and May, he has also contracted to meet Charles Ledoux, the French champion in London next month. This is a match that should draw a record crowd. Ledoux, who is to weigh 118 pounds, is a very formidable proposition for the English "Terror."

Want Ontario Entries

The Northwestern Curling Association, with headquarters at Duluth, Minn., which annually conducts an international bonspiel for the Louis W. Hill \$1,000 cup, is seeking entries this season from Toronto and other Ontario points. Heretofore Canada has been represented by rinks from Fort William, Port Arthur, Winnipeg and other western clubs. The bonspiel this season opens on January 20th.

Mr. Rothwell also reports that the French Government contemplates buying all the horses now in France belonging to the United States Government at the signing of the armistice. There were 166,554 horses in France valued at more than \$50,000,000.
