CHARGES WERE DISMISSED

WHICH WERE LAID IN POLICE COURT AGAINST PHYSICIAN.

Magistrate Farrell said he could not find on the evidence that the orders were given for liquor for beverage purposes—Decision will be appealed.

Magistrate Farrell gave this decision in the charges against a local physician, laid under section 51 of the Ontario Temperance Act, on Friday morning in dismissing all the charges against him. It was stated that the decision would be appealed.

The bulk of the orders issued by the accused were given during the epidemic of influenza here, and the magistrate remarked that persons suffering from this disease had been given liquor by a number of medical men.

Magistrate Farrell also stated that he did not feel like taking the responsibility of imposing a penalty on the accused on such evidence unless he was perfectly clear and satisfied that the accused did issue these orders with the intention of supplying liquor for beverage purposes.

The charges in this case were laid by license inspectors working under the Ontario License Board. G. R. Webster conducted the prosecution and A. B. Cunningham defended the accused.

Military Matters

As a result of the visit of Brig-Gen. Victor S. Williams to Barriefield, orders have been issued for the removal of the district depot to Barriefield with all subsidiary establishments which include the dental, pay section, and ordnance branch and a medical section.

Brig-Gen. V. S. Williams and Major McManus visited the Barriefield barracks on Thursday forenoon, and were well pleased with the conditions there.

A number of staff officers from Ottawa are conducting a thorough inspection of the district pay offices in the Richardson building.

Lieut. S. Jordan has been detailed as a member of a board of officers, which is to assemble at the call of the president, Lt.-Col. G. H. Gillespie, to inquire into and report upon the conditions surrounding the death of Sergeant P. Gordon, 3rd Battalion C. G. R.

Major E. H. Lancaster, C.F.A. assumes temporary command of the R.C.H.A. Depot.

The troops from the S.S. Scotian were given furlough at Montreal, and the Kingston men arrived here Friday morning. A party of eight men and their dependents from the S.S. Metagama are now on their way to the city, and are expected to arrive on Saturday morning.

The Army and Navy Veterans, assisted by the ladies' auxiliary, gave a concert for the soldiers in the recreation room, at the Barriefield barracks on Thursday evening.

The S.S. Olympic will probably dock at Halifax on Friday, and the men on board for the Kingston district will be started on their journey to the city without delay. The new system of transporting the troops to their dispersal areas will be tried out with this party, and there should be no trouble in having reliable information as to their arrival in Kingston. There are close on five hundred for this district on board.

Nursing-sister Davlop, C.A.M.C., who has been on duty at the Cobourg Military Hospital, is in Kingston awaiting discharge as medically unfit.
