MADE MATRON-IN-CHIEF.

Miss Edith Rayside Heads Nursing Sisters in Canada.

Miss Edith Rayside, B.A., a graduate of Queen's University, has been appointed matron-in-chief of the nursing sisters in Canada. Miss Rayside is a native of Lancaster, Ont., and graduated in arts in 1895. She saw considerable service in France, Belgium and England during the war, and was in charge of organization work in hospitals in England. For her splendid services, especially at the Moore Barracks Hospital, Shorncliffe, she was awarded the Royal Red Cross Medal of the First Class, which she received at the hands of the King at Buckingham Palace. Miss Rayside has been nominated for the board of trustees of Queen's University, and has consented to stand. She is the first woman to be so nominated.

New Trustee Appointed.

Major L. C. Lockett, who has been appointed a member of the Board of Education by the City Council, is a son of F. G. Lockett, who served the board as trustee for a number of years, and rendered good service. After returning from service overseas, Major Lockett was appointed as a member of one of the local tribunals dealing with applications for exemptions from military service.

TAE POULTRY SHOW OPENS

THERE ARE 850 ENTRIES OF FOWL, PIGEONS AND RABBITS.

The Exhibition is in the Armouries, and is to continue for three days—Frank Kiell Has Eighty Birds Entered.

The Kingston Poultry Association opened at the Armouries at noon Tuesday. There are already 850 entries of utility and fancy breeds of fowl, as well as rabbits and pigeons. Many of those on exhibit were winners at the Ottawa and Guelph fairs. There are twenty exhibition and utility pens. A more beautiful collection of birds it would be difficult to find. Frank Kiell has 80 birds entered. The show will be concluded on Thursday night. Judging began at 3 p.m. to-day. The judges are R. C. Coffey, Kingston, and A. Mason, of Ottawa.

The local officers are: Charles Anglin, president; E. H. Hurd, secretary; H. Walsh, superintendent.

There are three pens containing white wyandottes, barred rocks and black leghorns that are to be given away free to the holder of the right numbered ticket. Among the most important breeds to be seen are white, black and brown leghorns, white wyandottes, Rhode Island reds, blue andalusians, brahmas and langshans, partridge rocks, black rocks, minoreas, cambians, orange-oringtons, hamburgs, and others.

DECIDING WHAT TO DO

With the Catholic Army Hat Fund Recently Subscribed.

Mr. Schenek, of the executive committee, is in the city conferring with the local Roman Catholic church organizations respecting the use to be made of the Catholic army hat fund. The appeal, made through the Knights of Columbus just before the armistice, was concluded, was a great success, and a very large sum of money was subscribed. Mr. Schenek was not prepared to make a statement for publication as to the distribution, but expected to be in a position to do so in a day or two. He felt, however, that a portion of the money would be expended locally.

Action May Follow.

A number of people interested in social conditions in Kingston met informally in the office of W. F. Nickle, M.P., on Monday afternoon to discuss the matter. Those present talked over the conditions in the city and various means whereby they could be improved, and also discussed the possibility of establishing some means whereby a social worker could be secured to give full attention to the improvement of the surroundings and methods of living of the poorer classes of the community. Nothing definite was done, but the matter was gone into very fully and some action may result from the conference.
