MEDITERRANEAN SQUADRON. Orders Given to Prepare for Two Years' Foreign Service.

London, Jan. 21 .- The Sunday Express states that the Government intends to place on the reserve the British Mediterranean squadron sending there a particularly strong squadron. It declares orders have been given for the first battle squadron to prepare for two years' oreign service. The squadron will nclude the Iron Duke, Benbow, Marlborough, the Empress of India, and the Canada. A light cruiser squadron and two flotillas of destroyers will accompany the battle fleet and their base will be at Malta as heretofore.
