MEDITERRANEAN SQUADRON.

Orders Given to Prepare for Two Years' Foreign Service.

London, Jan. 21.—The Sunday Express states that the Government intends to place on the reserve the British Mediterranean squadron, sending there a particularly strong squadron. It declares orders have been given for the first battle squadron to prepare for two years' foreign service. The squadron will include the Iron Duke, Benbow, Marlborough, the Empress of India, and the Canada. A light cruiser squadron and two flotillas of destroyers will accompany the battle fleet and their base will be at Malta as heretofore.

London, Jan. 21.—A German Government wireless message received says: "Starving workmen are parading the streets of Petrograd and many riots have occurred. These were suppressed by troops from China and Korea, who were welcomed by Bolsheviks as 'pioneers of the Oriental International Equally.'"

THE CANADIAN FORCES

NOW IN FRANCE WILL RETURN OVERSEAS IN UNITS.

To be Sent Back in Following Order: The Third, First, Second and Fourth Divisions.

London, Jan. 21.—Present plans call for demobilization of the Canadian Corps in France in the following order: The 3rd, 1st, 2nd and 4th divisions. The divisions in this order will be brought to Branshat and Witely Camps and the men will go before the medical boards there and return home by units. The units of the 3rd division should begin to arrive in Canada in March, and from the other divisions named in the succeeding months, so that July should see practically the whole army that was in France returned home. There will still be a considerable number of other Canadian troops to return after that date.

The transport of the dependents of Canadian troops will probably be controlled by J. Osh Smith, Canadian representative of the Department of Immigration. He will have the co-operation of the military authorities.
