A Gift for the Princess.

Government House, Toronto, Jan. 21.—(To the Editor):—After the announcement of the engagement of Her Royal Highness, Princess Patricia of Connaught, the wives of the Lieutenant-governors of the various provinces of the Dominion were asked to hold a silver shower of five cents and upwards in order that the people of Canada might have the opportunity, should they desire to contribute, of sending a national gift to show their appreciation and regard for one who became endeared to so many during her Highness's stay in Canada, and in remembrance of the work accomplished by the Duke of Connaught and the great interest which he evinced in our soldiers from coast to coast, as well as the famous Princess Patricia Light Infantry, so dear-to-the-hearts of the Canadians.

The collection will be purely voluntary and the nature of the gift will be decided upon as soon as it is known what amount has been collected. I am therefore asking the people throughout Ontario, through the press, to co-operate with me in this voluntary collection towards the wedding gift for the Princess, either individually or through any organized society or association to which they may belong, and this letter will be the only intimation either to individuals or societies.

Sir Edmund Walker has kindly consented to be the honorary treasurer of the fund, and all monies should be sent to him on or before February 20th, 1919, to the Canadian Bank of Commerce, 23 King Street West, Toronto.

Under 50 in German Prisons. London, Jan. 22.—Less than 50 Canadian prisoners now remain in Germany. Some of these, it is feared, will never be located, as they probably have succumbed while trying to escape. A few are ill and a few more are attending on them. The total already repatriated is 3,400, while 304 were repatriated before the armistice.
