In the World of Sport

CARPENTIER INJURED.

Dislocated Thumb Puts Him Out of Running.

Georges Carpentier, the French heavyweight, whose name has been coupled with that of Jack Dempsey as leading candidates for the opportunity to meet Jess Willard next July in the championship match which he has contracted to fight, is out of the running, according to William H. ("Sparrow") Robertson, sporting expert, who recently returned from France.

Carpentier, he said, is suffering from a dislocated thumb, and this fact, coupled with war time regulations, has prevented him from keeping in the physical condition necessary for a bout with the champion. After peace has been signed and Carpentier has fought one or two preliminary bouts with European pugilists, he hopes to meet the American champion, Robertson says Carpentier's manager told him.

In the English Derby.

The most recent English Racing Calendar contains a list of the horses left in next season's Epsom Derby. The stallions most numerous represented are Bayardo, Polymelus and Sunstar, each with nine candidates. Cylrad and Swynford come next with six apiece, while Marcovil, Lemberg and Spanish Prince are each responsible for five, and the Tetrarch, Cicero, Prince Palatine, Roi Herode and Orby each for four. Stallions with three representatives are Charles O'Malley, White Magic and Royal Realm, Tracery, the sire of the favorite, The Panther, has two candidates, as also Spearmin, Valens, Wiltony, Juggernaut, Simon Square, Chaucer, Greenback, Sunder, Stedfast, Predicteur and Santol, while twenty-seven other sires have only one representative.

Toronto's New Athletic Building.

The new Toronto Athletic Club building on University Ave., will cost in the neighborhood of half a million dollars, and will be built in modern style. Toronto has long needed such a club. In fact, since the old Toronto Club on College street went out of existence, the Queen city has lacked such an organization.

Daylight Saving Popular in Sports.

At a meeting of the board of governors of the Manitoba branch of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada, a resolution was passed directing the secretary to forward to the federal government at Ottawa a request that the daylight savings measure for the Dominion be re-enacted by this coming session.

Fear Effect on 'Chases.

Racing men interested in the steeplechase branch of the sport fear the effect the present agitation against the gelding will have on the game. If the Jockey Club decides to exclude unsexed horses from all early-closing races it will so discourage the gelding of colts that there will be few high-class thoroughbreds fit for racing over the brush courses.

There are practically no entire horses of merit racing through the field, all the good ones being either mares or geldings. If the gelding is legislated out of existence it may mean that steeplechasing will have to be abandoned because of the lack of high-class horses.

Prefers Fights to Speeches.

At the recent international service bouts for the cup donated by King George, the patriotic sense was well in evidence, says the London Sportsman, when the idol of the navy, Sir David Beatty, entered the hall quietly and took a ringside seat. He was immediately recognized and in response to the cry of "Speech!" told the cheering crowd that he came to "see the bouts—fair, many sports—and not to make speeches. Moreover, as the war was finished, people were saying that the talkers were taking the place of the fighters, so he had better sit down," which he did, amid renewed cheering.

Canadian Team of R. Bisley.

The Army Council has given its approval to a meeting of the National Rifle Association being held this year. Arrangements will accordingly be made for a meeting in July.

The Bisley ranges have been in the hands of the army authorities since the war opened. The announcement received recently from Canada that the Dominion was anxious to send a team has given much satisfaction here.

To Open April 23rd.

The American baseball season will open April 23rd, the date set for the opening of the major leagues, with Kansas City playing at Columbus, Milwaukee at Louisville, Minneapolis at Toledo, and St. Paul at Indianapolis. The schedule will be submitted to the club owners for adoption by a mail vote, President Hickey said.

Dr. Roller's Broken Rib.

The wrestling match between Dr. B. F. Roller and Ronaldo Guardini, Italian champion, scheduled for three falls, at New Haven, Conn., ended in the first set, when Dr. Roller sustained a broken rib as the result of a fall.

Where is Golf Ball of Canada.

At present Great Britain and the United States supply the world with golf balls. A few months before the outbreak of the war a big company was formed in Germany, to capture the trade, and some specimens of the balls it produced reached England. Their merit was recognized, but that company is not likely to see the fulfillment of its dreams. All the British companies report a record demand this season for the rubber cotes, and it is a pretty safe bet that an increase in price may be anticipated. Demands from South Africa alone increased five fold since 1914 and those from Canada, Australia and India have at least doubled. During the war it has been impossible for manufacturers to meet demands, but it is expected that in a few months there will be large supplies on the market. The question has often been asked why Canadian rubber goods manufacturers do not get into the game. There should be a good field in Canada for a ball of standard worth. At present there is not a ball manufactured here, although the consumption runs into tens of thousands.

President Branch Hickey of the St. Louis Nationals announced yesterday that the financial difficulties of the Cardinals were being satisfactorily adjusted, and that the club would not be sold under \$190,000 second mortgage.
