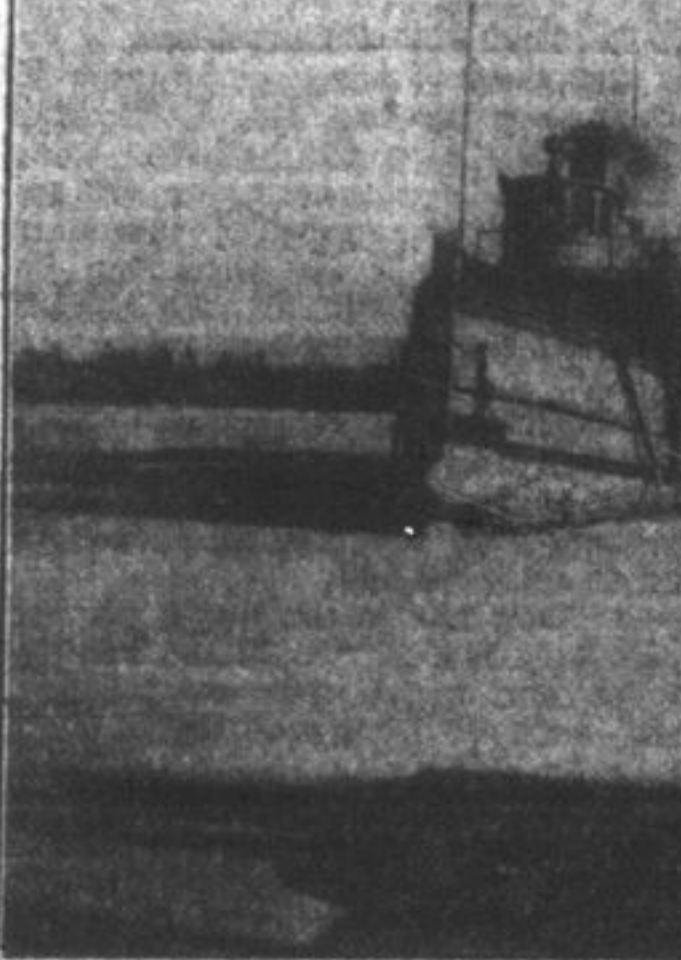

BOATS RAN TILL FEB. 2ND IN 1906.
 There is no cause for anxiety as regards the ice harvest, for February has yet to come. The above picture, taken by a Whig man, shows the steamer New Island Wanderer approaching Folger's wharf on the 2nd day of February, 1906, when navigation closed till the following April of that year. The harbor was late "taking" in 1906, owing to continued weather changes, and the boats ran until the 2nd of February. On that day the thermometer registered twenty degrees below zero, and it did not take long for Kingston's dear old harbor to put on a thick coat of ice. The steamer in the picture came into the wharf through three-quarters of an inch of ice, which was forming very rapidly. So there's lots of time for the icemen yet.
