MISS E. MCCALLUM ARRIVES AT ST. JOHN
 This Kingston Missionary in Turkey Was Interned During the War.
 A despatch from St. John, N.B., says: Included in the passengers on the Coriscan to-day was Miss E. McCallum, of Kingston, Ont., who was Congregational missionary in Turkey in charge of an American school, and was interned at the outbreak of the war in Smyrna. For the first two years she was allowed to go on teaching, but after that she was forbidden to do so. During this period, however, she was not forced to suffer any hardships, as the governor of Smyrna was rather friendly to the British, and treated his prisoners better than they did in any other part of Turkey. Miss McCallum said it seemed as if they were the first to be released, and the outcome would be and acted accordingly.

MOTHER AND BABY SAVED FROM DROWNING
 Broke Through the Ice—Rescued by Dr. W. A. McCarthy and Son.
 Mrs. Robert Miller and baby, four months old, of Wolfe Island, were driving across the ice on Monday when the horse broke through. The woman, with the child in her arms was thrown into the water. Dr. W. A. McCarthy and his son were within a short distance away and upon hearing the cry for help ran to the spot and assisted in getting the mother and child out of the water. The doctor took them to his own home where comforts were promptly provided. The clothes of the mother and child were frozen and they were supplied with dry ones. They remained overnight with Dr. and Mrs. McCarthy and went home on an ice yacht on Tuesday morning.

THE G.W.V.A. ENDORSES
 The Action of Ontario Magistrates in Sentencing Defaulters.
 At the meeting of the G.W.V.A. Monday evening the chairman of the membership committee outlined the "offense" which would be undertaken in the near future to boost the membership of this branch, and asked for the co-operation of all members on this subject. The land settlement scheme was brought up for discussion and it was resolved that the Dominion executive be co-operated with in their efforts to obtain legislation on this subject that there were no available lands held by the Crown which were of value for the purpose of cultivation by returned men, or very little, and that they were purchasing more lands for this purpose, at it is understood a tremendous cost, and re-selling the same to returned men; the argument put forward was why could not the Government spend the money in building railways, etc. through crown lands at present of no value, thus making such lands valuable from the farmer's point of view, and allow returned soldiers to settle thereon after the railways are completed.

The matter of offenders under the military service act was brought up for discussion, and it was resolved to heartily endorse the action of Ontario magistrates in sentencing offenders to very severe punishment, and also that the meeting much regret that Quebec magistrates, on the whole, do not meet out justice to such offenders.

METHODIST DISTRICT MEETING

 The February meeting of the Kingston Methodist district was held in Queen street Methodist church on Monday. Rev. J. D. Ellis, the chairman, presided, and all the ministers and representative laymen of the district were present, numbering twenty-four or more.

The principal business of the session was the consideration of the co-operative movements. Suggestions were made and discussed, but there will be no announcement made regarding action to be taken until the matter has been acted upon by all the churches.
