GAVE LECTURE ON EGYPT INCIDENTS OF THE DAY

BEFORE THE WOMAN'S CANADIAN CLUB THURSDAY EVE.

Rev. Dr. R. J. Wilson Gave Interesting Description of the Wonders of the Land of the Pharaohs.

Rev. Dr. R. J. Wilson gave a most interesting lecture on "Egypt" before the Woman's Canadian Club at Convocation Hall on Thursday evening.

Dr. Wilson had made an extensive tour through Egypt and he had pictures of the wonderful historic monuments that have been in existence thousands of years and which are to-day objects of peculiar interest to historians and scientists.

The Suez Canal, which was a valuable connecting link with India, reducing the distance from England to India by about 2,000 miles and to China by nearly 4,000 miles.

But for the great river Nile, which overflows its banks forming a fertile barren waste, and Dr. Wilson described how it was the source of life to the populations in the long history of the country and became to them a sacred river and how the alligator became a sacred animal.

The pyramids were next shown. Even at the present day amongst all the wonders of modern science they are wonders. The largest one is 435 feet high and modern engineers are unable to explain how the massive blocks of stone, of which they are composed were brought from great distances and put in position.

The embalming process employed by the early Egyptians is unknown to this day. The body of Rameses, though 3,000 years old is still wonderfully preserved. The Sphinx which stands near the pyramids still remains a riddle to scholars.

Dr. Wilson received a great inspiration from the Sphinx which seems to have been conceived by a man looking out over the great advancing desert of sand bidding defiance to its destruction, for then, as now, the sand constituted the greatest menace to man's works.

George E. Hague occupied the chair, and much interest was shown in the proposal to invite discussion by the members of current questions.
