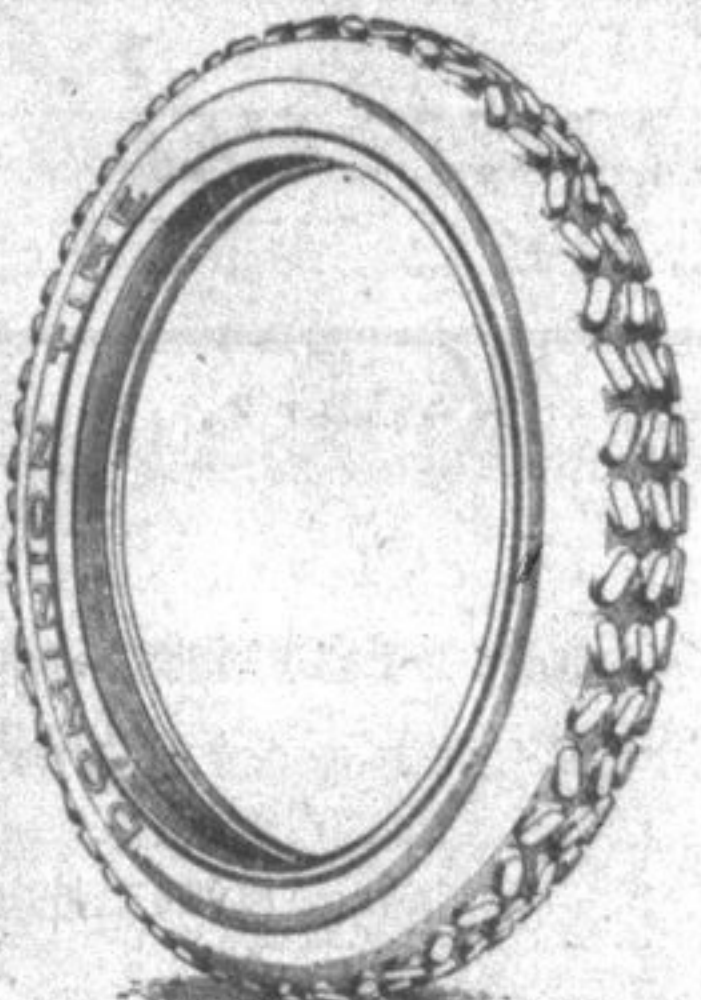

DR. H. D. GIRDWOOD HERE

SHOWS HIS FILM, "WITH EMPIRE'S FIGHTERS," AT GRAND.

House Was Crowded for Three Productions on Monday, and it Will be Shown Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Dr. H. D. Girdwood, who went to France and right into the firing line and braved the dangers there, to secure moving pictures of the Imperial troops in action, is showing his film at the Grand Opera House, and gave his first production on Monday afternoon to a crowded house. The title of this film is "With the Empire's Fighters," and in it he shows in a very graphic way the real work that has been done and the true meaning of the glorious words which have been spoken so often to commend the fighting of Haig's troops.

Dr. Girdwood went to France himself, and with a competent camera-man took pictures of those things which are interesting and instructive, but he did not fail to include scenes which would tell the story truly even if they were not as palatable as the sights of boys enjoying themselves at sports and otherwise.

The Indian cavalry, which was supported for many months near St. Quentin by the R.C.H.A. batteries of Kingston, forms a prominent part of the film. In it he shows that these Gurkhas from India were brave fighters and good comrades and were taken into close comradeship by the British and Canadian soldiers. Their swarthy faces did not hide their true British hearts, and as fighters that were equal to any in the line they were given the respect by the other fighters that was their due. Dr. Girdwood shows them at work, at play, eating, using their deadly knives, handling their spears from on horse-back and photographed parts of their life in France, which on the screen gives a clear idea of the splendid part they played.

The portrait of the Prince of Wales is one of the best that has ever been taken, and it was arranged by Queen Mary for the Canadian public. The prince appears to be what he has been described, very quiet and unassuming and rapidly taking on those characteristics which should in time make him a worthy successor to the King.

Though the Indians are very prominent in the picture, there are many other features which are particularly appealing to Canadians, and these include very realistic pictures of artillery in action, the big guns that have been firing shells of tremendous size into Fritz's lines are shown actually in action and the recoil indicates the pressure that is applied to the shell and gives some idea of the damage which such a shell must make when it touches its target.

An actual "over the top" scene, in which the Indians advance to take a trench, is photographed in a remarkably clear way. The pictures were taken from a concealed emplacement that protected the camera and the result is undoubtedly one of the best pictures of this important work that has ever been shown in Kingston.

The handling of the wounded after the attack is also shown, and the careful way that they are taken to the operating table and the efficient and humane way in which operations are carried out by skilled surgeons is depicted.

Not the least of the entertainment is Dr. Girdwood's lecture. As the different features are unfolded on the screen he gives in a concise but thorough manner a vivid description of their inner meaning, and the talk adds tremendously to the value of the show. Accompanying his talk he has a most complete orchestra, which furnishes suitable music to each picture as shown.

On Monday afternoon the school children were present, and must have benefited greatly from the picture. The house was crowded and they vented their delight by cheering and applauding in an unmistakable way.

The film is being given to-day (Tuesday), Wednesday and Thursday, with a matinee production each day.

Mayor Newman was present at the evening production of "With the Empire's Fighters" and introduced Dr. Girdwood to the audience in a few well-chosen words of tribute to the doctor and his efforts to secure a moving picture of the troops in France.

THE WOMEN ASKS THINGS

WANT A MORE RIGID CENSORSHIP OF MOTION PICTURES.

Ask That Two Women be Placed on the Board of Health—Seeking for Re-afforestation.

The following resolutions were passed at the executive meeting of the local Council of Women:

That the National Council of Women of Canada be requested to endorse the following:

"Resolved, that the National Council of Women of Canada, realizing the great influence of motion pictures on the minds of the growing boy and girl of our land, again petition the legislatures of the various provinces that a more rigid censorship of films be exercised and that at least two women be appointed to each board where this is not already the case.

"Resolved, that a request be sent from this local council to the medical health officer and the police commissioner asking for their cooperation in the matter of registering rooming and boarding houses, and to the city council asking that two women be added to the Board of Health.

"Resolved, that the National Council of Women of Canada be requested to petition the parliament of the dominion and the legislatures of the different provinces that re-afforestation be taken up and carried on in order to give immediate work to the unemployed and to add to the wealth of the country by (1) utilizing waste land and improving existing forests, and (2) by thereby improving the general climatic conditions and enhancing the agricultural value of the country."

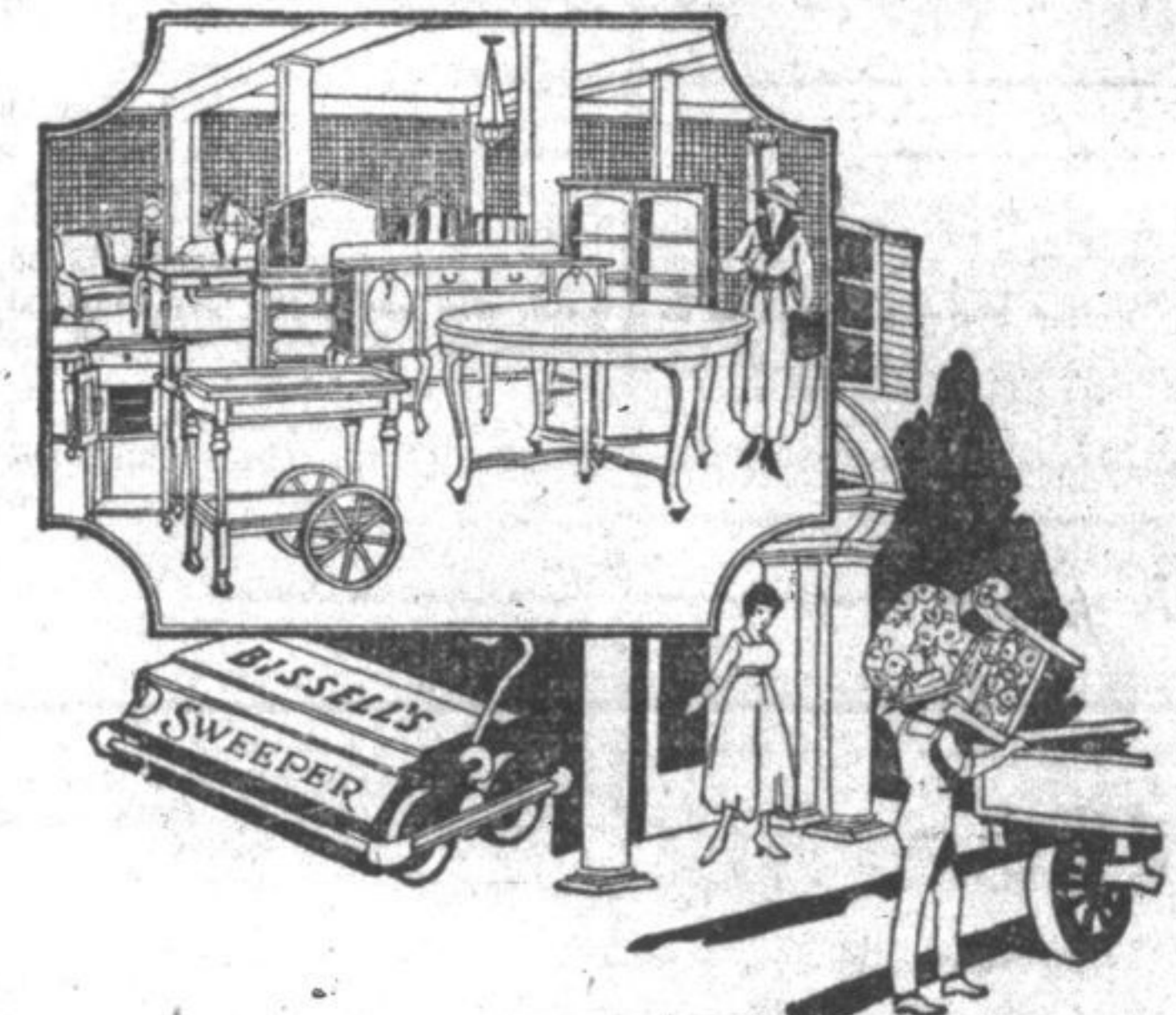
