OBJECTORS RETURN WAGES AS SOLDIERS
Claim Their Scruples Forbid the Acceptance of Pay From Army.

Washington, Feb. 26.—Nearly all the conscientious objectors recently released by the army at Fort Leavenworth have returned the money paid them on discharge, holding that the scruples which prevented them from fighting also forbade acceptance of pay for non-combatant service which relieved a fighter for the front.

It was learned to-day that about \$5,000 had been returned and remittances still were coming in.

TO COMMEMORATE WAR.
New Quebec Townships Will Bear Historic Names.

Quebec, Feb. 26.—Hon. Louis Allard, Minister of Lands and Forests, has approved of the desire of the Geographical and Literary Institute of Quebec, that a number of new townships in the counties of Montcalm, Pontiac and Joliette shall bear names which will commemorate the great war, and the part that Canada played therein. These counties will bear the names of Poch, Petain, Haig, D'Esperey and Diaz, in commemoration of great Allied generals, and Vimy, Postribert, Cambrai, Ypres, Denain and Lens as victories in which the Canadians played a glorious part.
