REVENUE AT POST OFFICE

RECEIPTS AT KINGSTON LAST YEAR WERE \$112,780.96.

Interesting Statistics Gathered From Report of the Postmaster General—Revenue Derived From Many of the Post Offices in the Kingston District.

The report of the Postmaster General, for the year ended March 31st, 1918, shows the gross revenue for Kingston at \$112,780.96, made up as follows:

DR. TAYLOR IN TORONTO.
Queen's Principal Gives Address On Sir Sandford Fleming.

A Toronto despatch says: At the Royal Canadian Institute Saturday, Dr. Bruce Taylor, principal of Queen's University, gave an interesting address on the late Sir Sandford Fleming. He spoke of his various activities in connection with railroad life in this country, pointing out that his first real extensive job as a constructionist was on the Intercolonial. He was chief engineer of C.P.R. until 1889, and was greatly interested in railway ideas. He further stated that Sir Sandford, who was a Scotchman born in Kirkcaldy, was formerly Chancellor in Queen's University, in which he took so much interest. He referred to the reform of time advocated by Sir Sandford, which would do away with the changing of clocks when travelling from east to the west. Among the books he had written were "Time and Its Notation" and "Memories on Universal Time."

On Saturday afternoon Dr. Taylor attended the annual meeting of the Toronto Alumni Association of Queen's University. Yesterday he preached in the morning in the Deer Park Presbyterian Church, and in the evening in St. Andrew's, King street west.

At the Canadian Mining Institute meeting in Montreal Dr. W. L. Goodwin, Kingston, read a paper on titanium from ore in Canada, and drew attention to the valuable by-products secured by smelting it, not the least of which was an excellent white paint better than white lead.

QUEEN'S AND RESEARCH.

Dr. Drummond Also Complains of Shabby Treatment Accorded.

In an open letter to Dr. A. B. MacCallum, chairman of advisory council for research, Ottawa, Dr. A. T. Drummond, Grimsby East, a trustee of Queen's University, expresses his disappointment over the way Queen's was ignored in the appointment of the advisory research council. He says:

"I do not know who suggested to the Government the names of the advisory council for research, but was surprised to find that while it included two McGill men and two 'Varsity men, Queen's was altogether ignored, and five other gentlemen were added, some of whom, however skilled in their own departments of work, could hardly be said to have previously taken any interest in industrial research."

Further, when the advisory council announced that special facilities were to be provided at the universities for the encouragement of research work, it was once more to McGill and Toronto Universities that these facilities were to be specially given.

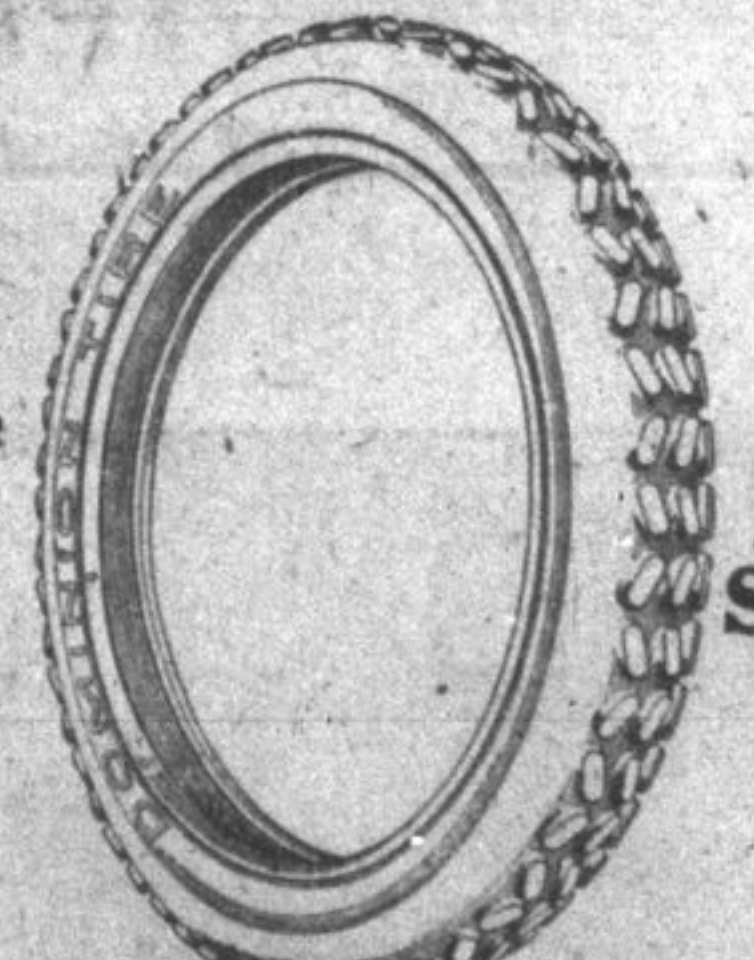

The mayor has received a list of persons who have failed to pay personal property and statute labor taxes for the years 1916 and 1917. The list embraces over 500 names.

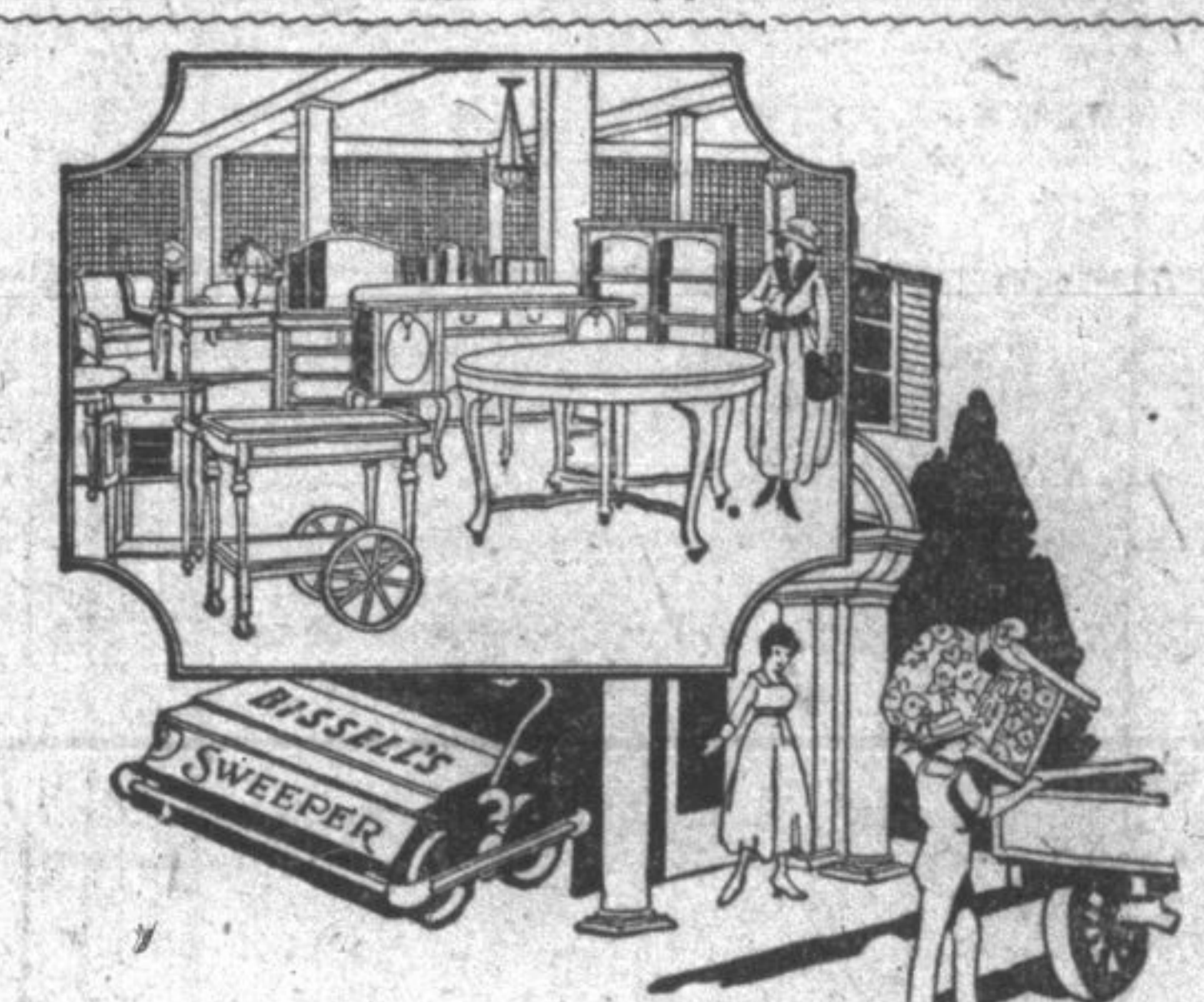

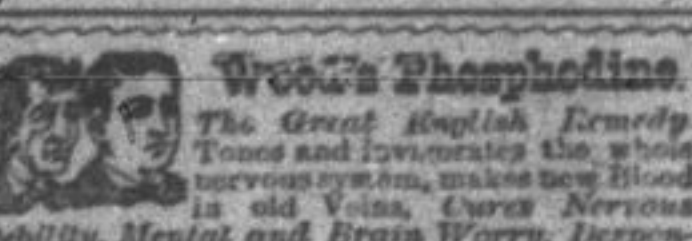
