BOTH TEAMS ARE GOOD.

But Kingston is a Team to Be Feared.

In speaking of the Kingston-Collingwood intermediate championship game in Toronto to-night, the Toronto Star says:

"Both teams have made creditable records this season, and it appears a toss-up which is the better. Collingwood won the 1918 title, and it was their intention to compete in the O.H.A. again this season, but they recently waived their right to so compete, and are determined to make every effort to again win the intermediate championship. Ernie Fryer and Bekker have been playing for the shipbuilders since the days they helped Noah lay the keels for the ark; while Cook, the goalkeeper, broke in in 1907. Fryer has long been regarded as a star, and Cook is a net-minder of no mean ability. McLeod and the Poulis brothers are the younger members of the team, and all are fast and tricky. McLeod plays right defence, possesses considerable weight, and is conceded to be the best man on the sextette.

"Kingston, led by 'Rube' Millan of Dental fame, are a team to be feared. They are coming here full of confidence, and every fan in the limestone believes that they are good enough to win the title. The forward line, composed of the Millan boys, Smith and Derry, has been showing good form all season, while Brown, Elmer and Hagerman make a strong defence. Walsh in goal is away above the average, and the Collingwood sharpshooters will have to be at their best to beat him.

Y.M.C.A. WANTS \$6,000

And a Committee Will Make Canvass of the Citizens.

The finance committee of the Y.M.C.A. met with their chairman, R. L. Ward, last night, and arranged the budget for the ensuing year. In addition to the amount which will be secured from the small fee charged for membership, etc., the association will need \$6,000 in subscriptions to carry on its work for 1919, and also to permit a reduction of the overdraft of \$2,000. The committee reviewed the work of the past four years, during which war period the association has carried on an extensive patriotic programme in the interests of our boys who served overseas, and when the small membership revenue due to enlistments, was considered, great satisfaction was felt in knowing that thanks to the generosity of the citizens, the association was able to face the reconstruction of the war. The fact that the association is extending full privileges for six months to all the boys who come back, and thereby cannot expect large membership revenue, makes the committee feel that they have a good appeal to the citizens who have never yet failed the association in its financial efforts. The campaign will commence on Tuesday, March 25th, and a number of business men and others will endeavor in a week's canvass to raise the necessary \$6,000.

RAN OFF THE TRACK.

Night Train From Montreal Met With Mishap Near Morrisburg.

Grand Trunk train No. 19, due in Kingston from Montreal at 1 a.m., ran off the track near Morrisburg shortly after ten o'clock on Monday night, according to information received in the city on Tuesday morning. No word was received of any person being injured.

Citizens were wondering why they did not get their papers or letters from Montreal, but the mail was held up as a result of this accident. The train reached the city before 11 a.m. of about three o'clock on Monday when the engine and forward cars went off the rails, but the whole train came to a standstill practically on the track. None of the passengers or crew were injured.
