***** MURDER TRIAL WEDNESDAY. ***** Preliminary Hearing in Charge Against Mrs. Thompson Wednesday. The preliminary hearing in the case of Mrs. Lovice Thompson, arrested a week ago on charges of murder, following the finding of the body of an infant near the railway station, at Shartot Lake, will take place before Magistrate Farrell, in the Police Court on Wednesday morning.

On Monday afternoon Sergeant Samuel Armet summoned three nurses of the general hospital and also local doctor to give evidence in the case.

Road Asphalt Contract. The Board of Works has given a contract for asphalt cement for road paving to the United States Asphalt Refining Company. John Morris, representing the Imperial Oil Company, says his company tendered for the asphalt and on the city's requirements of 300 tons it was \$2,916 lower than the American company. He says the Imperial asphalt cement tests are just as high as those of the company which was given the contract, and that Toronto uses a great deal of it on its streets. The Board of Works is purchasing the same asphalt as it did before and has eighty tons over from last year.

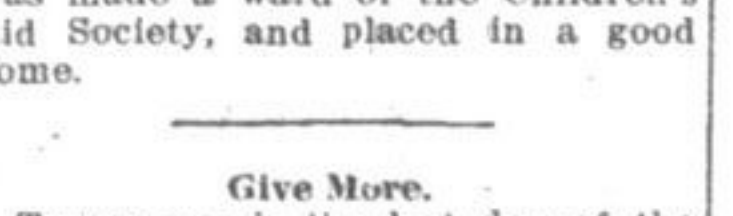
