"TRUE IRISH HEARTS"

PRESENTED AT THE GRAND ON ST. PATRICK'S EVENING.

A Very Large Audience Witnessed the Production of This Irish Play By Kingston Amateurs.

Saint Patrick's Day came to a fitting close at the Grand Opera House by the presentation of "True Irish Hearts," a play by local artists, in which Irish life with its humor, pathos, heart-touching music and emotionalism, was vividly portrayed before a large and highly appreciative audience. All of the seats were sold before four o'clock in the afternoon. It was a real Irish night. The audience was for the most part of Irish descent and the performers, who excelled in all their parts, were generously applauded.

The performance was opened by the orchestra which played a number of sweet melodies so characteristic of Irish music. The play was given in five acts. It is a romance with its setting in rural Ireland, and the scenery is beautiful. The villain is an Irishman named George Wolfe, who attempts to obtain possession of an estate and marry the beautiful heiress, Rose O'Neil, who opposes his design, being betrothed to Miles O'Connor, a young lawyer. He succeeds with the assistance of Batt Mooney in causing her disappearance under circumstances that point to murder, and Miles O'Connor is arrested, convicted and sentenced to death, but Lanty Lanagan, the hero of the piece, discovers the plot in time to save his friends. Harold Barrett, as Lanty Lanagan, in his courtship of Kitty Brady (Violet Egan), made a hit with his love song, which was sung in splendid voice, and Kitty played the Irish maiden's part to perfection. Miss Delerene Craig, whose voice is well known to Kingston audiences, took the prominent part of Rose O'Neil and sang "Blissful Anna," after the second act. AT THE STRAND.

Unusually Fine Programme of Pictures and Music.

A crowded house attended the Strand Theatre on Monday evening, and they were treated to an unusually fine programme of pictures and music. The feature picture was "The Romance of Tarzan," an entirely new film depicting the closing chapters of Edgar Rice Burroughs' story, "Tarzan of the Apes." It is far in advance of the preceding film of that name, and last night it thrilled the large audience who witnessed the production. The story is a beautifully romantic one, and it is filled with thrilling adventures. Tarzan, the ape-man, is the centre of these episodes, and in them he is helped by his friends of the jungle. Never before in any picture has there been so marvellous an exhibition of trained animals. From the smallest of the wild apes up to the mammoth elephant, Tarzan, which rescues Tarzan from a party of cannibals, these animals show remarkable intelligence and training, and add greatly to the interest and thrill of the screen production of a marvellous story. The play ends just as one would desire, and the onlookers on Monday evening watched breathlessly from start to finish.

Besides the feature picture, there was a splendid war film, showing the last great victory, of the Canadian troops in the war, the taking of Mons. In this film are shown many actual scenes which took place on the memorable battlefield, and also many scenes taken while the Canadian troops were advancing to the capture of the city. The showing of the projecting barrage which preceded the advance is especially good. An interesting scene in this film is the inspection of the Canadians by H. R. H. the Prince of Wales. In addition to these pictures an installment of the serial showing the wonderful feats of Houdini, the handcuff king, was also shown.

A feature of the programme was the singing of Frank Beasenger, the brilliant tenor, who delighted the audience with his Irish songs. "The Tumbledown Shack of Aphelone" was especially well received, and he also sang "Mother Machee" and "My Irish Song of Songs" in splendid voice. To-night he will sing a new programme, several of which will be sung by request. The same programme of pictures will be shown to-night and on Wednesday.

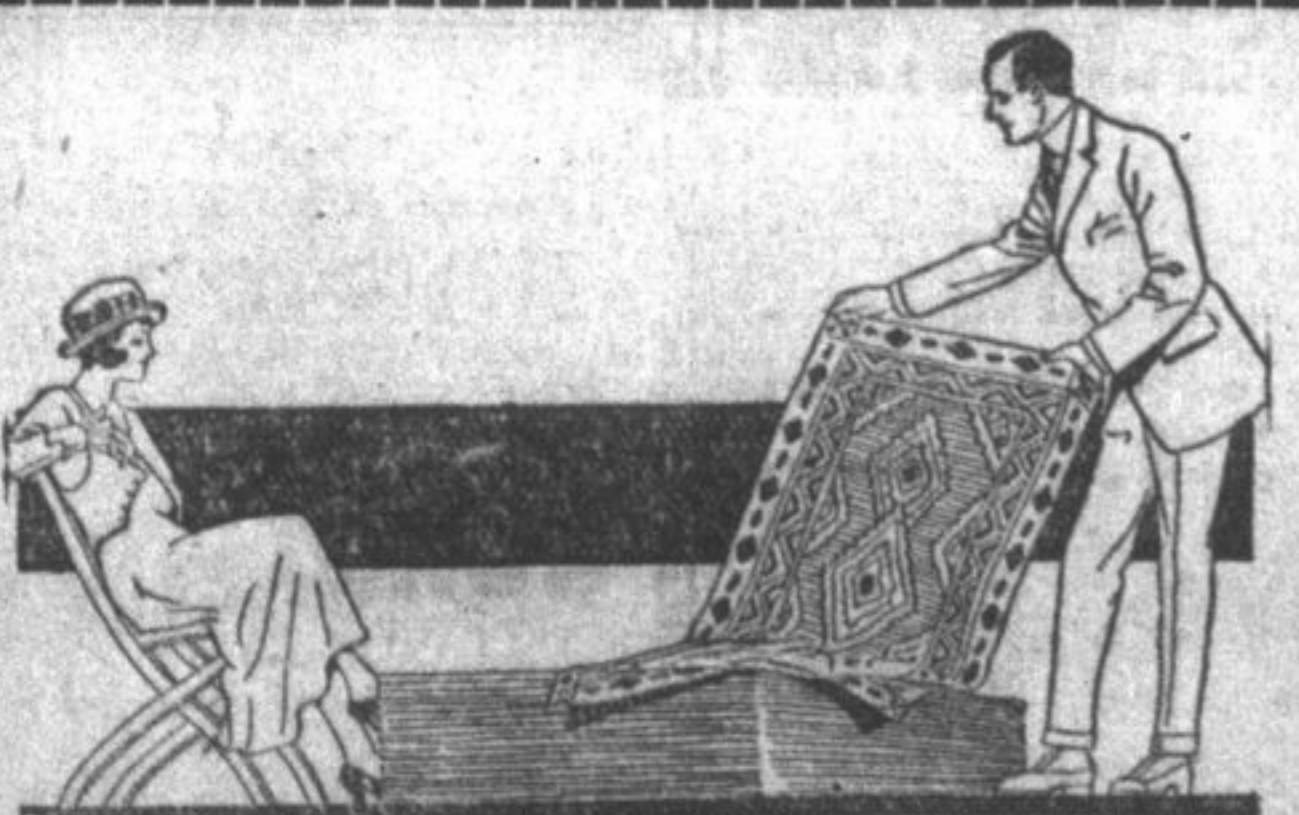
