To Express Their Views On the League of Nations. (Canadian Press Despatch) Paris, March 20.—Neutral countries of Europe, Asia, and South America will be given an opportunity today to express their views and propose amendments to the league of nations' plan. Nearby neutrals, such as Holland and Switzerland, have sent delegates while more distant countries will be represented by ambassadors and ministers residing in Paris. It is proposed to convene the session if necessary to-morrow in order to complete all neutral proposals and prepare them for admission to the commission on the league of nations.
