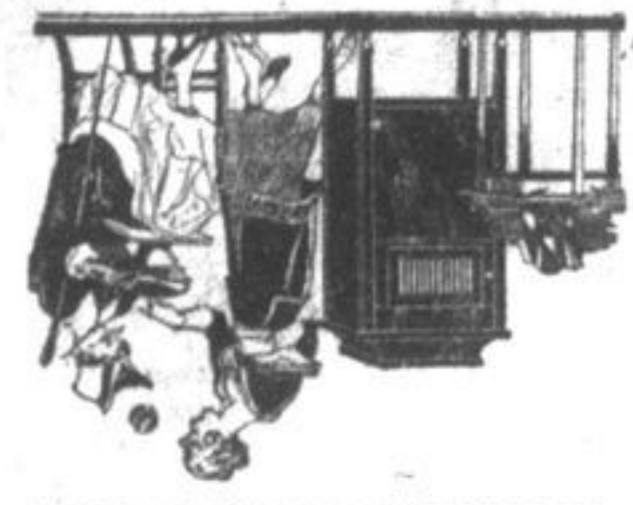

Of Miners' Difficulty in England Now Looked For.

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

London, March 21.—Representatives of the miners at a meeting last night discussed the report of the coal commission, but no definite decision was reached. It was stated, however, that the Sankey report created a favorable impression as a business-like document, and the general view is that the threefold strike had been averted. Transport workers claim a notable victory, and it is believed that the Sankey report meeting both miners and railway men in a spirit which promises a peaceful settlement.

He Criticised Men Who Served and Were Incapacitated.

Ottawa, March 21.—According to the Ottawa Journal, Lieut. Col. A. C. Pratt, M.P.P. for Norfolk, who made charges of incompetency, bungling, etc., against the staff at Argyll House, the Canadian headquarters in England, is himself without fighting service in the field, without wound stripes, and without decorations, while most of the men he complains about were men returned from France incapable of further service at the front.
