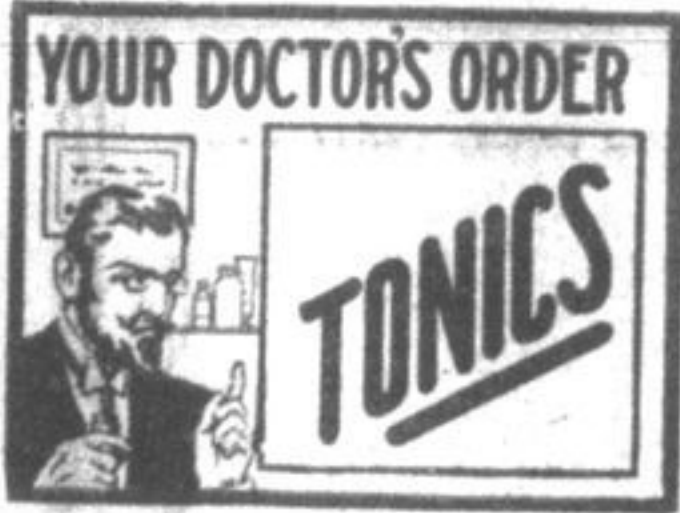

SYDENHAM'S ANNIVERSARY THE PROHIBITION ISSUE

PRINCIPAL SMYTHE OF MONTREAL THE SPECIAL PREACHER.

A Fuller Knowledge of God and Problems Arising Out of the War Were His Subjects—The Musical Programme.

Sydenham Street Methodist Church has passed another milestone, and the anniversary was observed on Sunday. Both services were very largely attended, the special speaker of the day being Rev. Principal James Smyth, L.L.D., of Montreal, who delivered two very thoughtful and forceful sermons. In his morning sermon he appealed for a fuller knowledge of God, and in the evening dealt with problems arising out of the war and how the church could meet them.

"We need a fuller knowledge of God in these perilous times," said Dr. Smyth, during the course of his morning sermon. "In these days when there is so much suffering as a result of the loss of loved ones you ask the question, does God know, does He care, is He guiding the affairs of the world, and will He bring peace out of all the turmoil? Your boys were in danger and you waited for the telegram to tell about his fate. Does God know all, you ask. Is there good to come out of it all? Does He care and are we His children?"

The speaker referred to the mysteries surrounding God and His work, and declared that these mysteries would only be manifested to the seekers for knowledge.

There were many misunderstandings and they were responsible for a great deal of trouble. Public men, in dealing with reforms, and religious teachers suffered as the result of misunderstandings.

The musical part of the programme was of an exceedingly high order. Miss Shaw, being in charge, presiding at the organ. With the members of the choir those who took a prominent part in the special numbers were Mrs. Douglas, of Montreal, a former member of the choir; Capt. Harold Agnew, Arthur Locke, Mr. Finley, Prof. Eaton and Ernest Madrand. The various numbers were well selected, and rendered with fine effect.

May Succeed Mr. Seath.

W. F. NICKLE OPTIMISTIC.
Believes Great Men Will Give Canada Railway Service.

Public ownership in parliament found strong champions in W. F. Nickle of Kingston in the course of his speech in the railway debate on Thursday night, Mr. Nickle said: "Somebody has said that you cannot have government operation and administration of railroads, because you cannot get men to run them honestly. I may be an idealist; I may look forward to Utopia, but in the eleven years I have been in public life there is one thing I have learned, and that is that we are making a tremendous advance along the line of the willingness of big men to do public service. When the war broke out we saw men for an ideal go to the front and be willing to sacrifice their lives for \$1.10 a day; they went to the front, moved, by that enthusiasm which makes men realize that to die for one's country is sweet, and I believe, sir, that the Canadians of this war will bring Canadians to realize that it is as sweet and as sweet for a man to die for a country, it is equally sweet for a man to live for his country. And I believe the time is coming. If the time is not already here, when great men may be had in Canada to run our national railway system. Not great business men simply because they have succeeded in a business that is not a railroad, but great men who have mastered a railway system; great men who understand railway operation, experts in railway administration."
