45TH MEN FROM THE R.C.H.A. Had Hacking Cough Couldn't Sleep Nights

BATTERY LEFT FOR OVERSEAS JUST TWELVE DAYS LATER.

Major A. C. GILL, an R.M.C. Graduate, Had the Command, and He Had a Fine Lot of Men.

The Whig files show many interesting events in the story of the training of the 45th overseas battery which is now on its way to Kingston. The battery was authorized on January 14th, 1916, to complete the 9th Artillery Brigade, which consisted later of the 22nd, 23rd, 45th, 46th Batteries and ammunition column. The ammunition column was at first known as the 34th Battery.

The first parade of the battery was held on Sunday, January 22nd, 1916, at 10.45 a.m., and the command formally taken over by Major A. C. Gill, the men previously having been in "C" Battery, R.C.H.A.

Major Gill graduated from the Royal Military College in 1907, and proved a most efficient officer with the battery. He was assisted by Lieutenants R. A. Adams, G. G. Aitkens and L. Kingston in the training, and when the battery left for overseas just twelve days after it had been formed it was well organized considering the short time allowed.
