THE SOCIAL CONSCIENCE TIDINGS FOR OUR READERS

OF THE PEOPLE NEEDS TO BE AWAKENED.

Address by Miss Helen Reid Before Women's Canadian Club on "Reconstruction and Social Service."

Miss Helen Reid, of Montreal, addressed the Women's Canadian Club, Wednesday evening, in Convocation Hall, on "Reconstruction and Social Service."

Miss Reid dealt most exhaustively with social conditions as they exist in the world to-day; their relationship to the revolutionary tendencies of the people lately engaged in the great world war, and the moral and economic condition of the people.

The speaker then showed that the great need of the hours is the awakening of a social conscience in the people in order that we might recognize and assume the responsibilities about us. Only in this way could democracy be made safe.

Two matters that called for effective action were public health and sanitary housing. The military medical boards showed the existence of diseases and physical defects that could have been remedied in early life.

Factory hours, conditions of labor and pay were matters to be considered under public health and housing. There should be an adequate wage to maintain a proper home.

At the conclusion of her address, Miss Reid answered a number of questions asked by members of the club, and in reply to the question of the importance of a gymnasium at the Y.W.C.A. she said that it was of great value in promoting the health and physical development of young ladies.

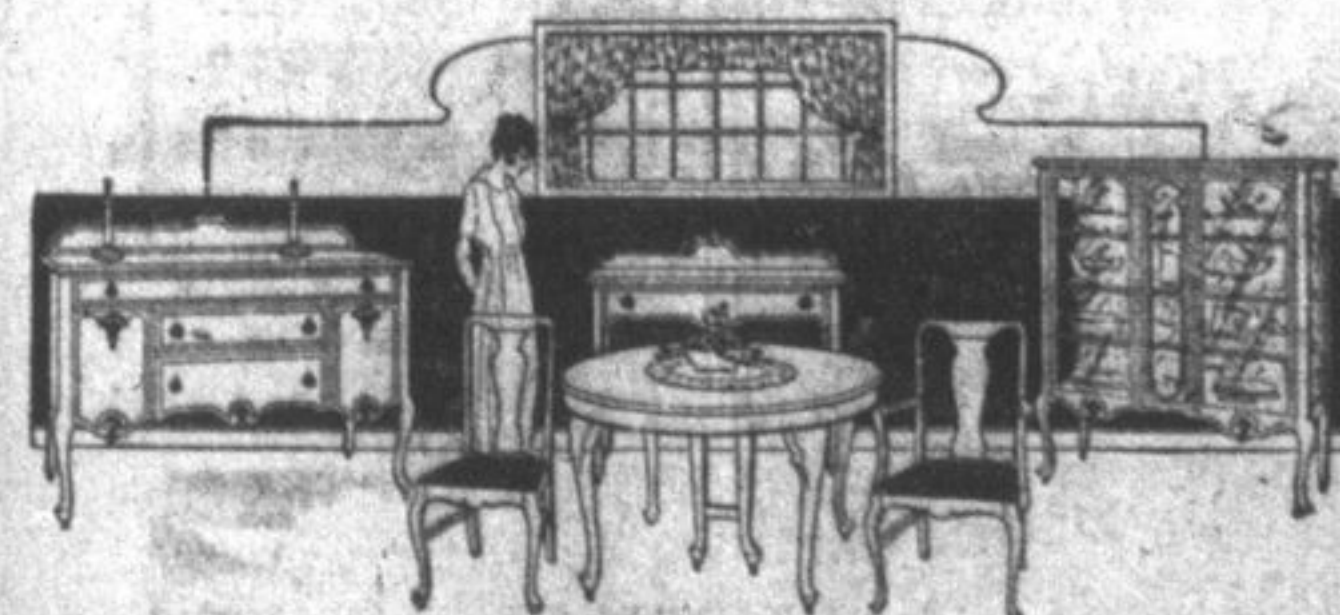
