Ottawa, - March 26.—Estimates which will shortly be proceeded with in parliament, provide out of the railway vote \$13,500,000 for improvements and extension in the west of the Canadian National Railway system. Of this amount \$9,500,000 will be spent on construction, and \$4,000,000 in betterments.
