## CANNOT ALLOW DISCOUNT

WHEN UTILITIES ACCOUNTS NOT PAID IN TIME.

Utilities Commission to Issue Bonds For Cost of Gas Tank So Rates May Not Be Increased.

At the meeting of the Utilities Commission Monday afternoon, C. J. Graham and Adjutant Harbor, who conducts the hostel for the Salvation Army asked for the remission of a discount of \$15 from an account of \$139.49 for service, although the hostel manager had failed to pay his account on the specified date, and had lost the discount. It appeared that similar requests had been made before and the Commission had declined to set a precedent. The matter was left to the chairman. Chairman Elliott reported that Davis and Farnham had signed a contract to put a steel lining in the new gas tank for \$9,500 and guarantee to make the tank absolutely watertight for an additional amount of \$500 to include a steel bottom if it were needed, all expense to be borne by them. The commission would have to fill the tank with water and empty it. Commissioner Hewitt moved that the contract be accepted, and it was carried.

City Treasurer Bartels submitted a statement upon the city's finances and the commission decided in view of the expenditure required to complete the tank, to submit the matter to the finance committee and ask that bonds to the amount of \$2,000 be issued in order that the entire cost of the tank might be distributed over a period of twenty years, and obviate the necessity of increasing present rates to consumers.

Mayor Newman moved the acceptance of a contract with the Arthur Jewitt Co. for a year's supply of chlorine at 13.60 cents per pound. This was a reduction in the former price.

The city's programme for work on the roads was considered and Commissioner Hewitt and Manager Folger were authorized to take the matter up with the Board of Works. Accountant Patterson requested permission to buy an addressograph to facilitate the work of making out gas, water and light accounts. The price is \$1,000 and the matter was left to the chairman and accountant to deal with.

The Hydro Electric Commission account for the month amounted to \$3,217.90, which was considered very satisfactory, and authority was given to pay it.

The Chief of the Fire Department asked for forty hydrants, but action was deferred.

Chairman Smith reported that the Commission would save from \$12,000 to \$15,000 this year on gas and oil. These accounts were passed:

## CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS.

Change of Time at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 30.  
All clocks and watches used in operation of Canadian National Railways will, at 2 a.m. Sunday, March 30th, be advanced one hour to prevent serious confusion and inconvenience to the public. The attention of all concerned is directed to the following conditions resulting from this important change of time:

If cities, towns, villages and other municipal bodies do not change their local time to correspond with the new railway time, all concerned should keep in mind that while trains continue to leave railway stations on present schedule, such schedule will be operated one hour ahead of present local time. Therefore in municipalities where local time is not changed to correspond with the new railway time passengers must reach railway stations one hour earlier than shown in current folders and public time table posters.
