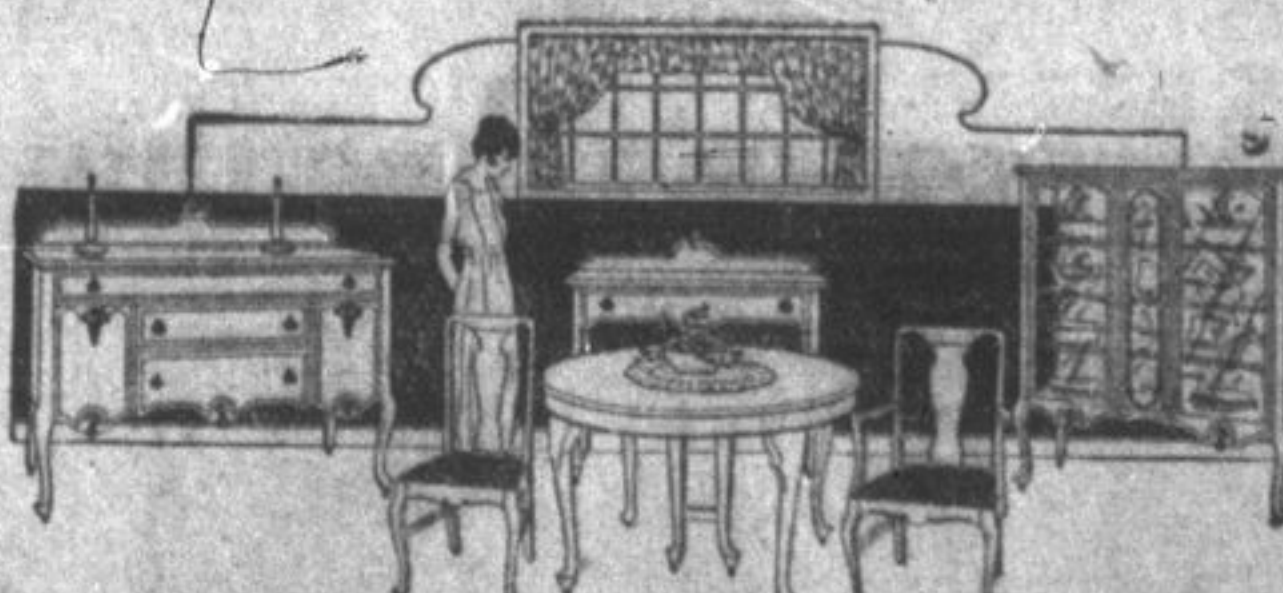

men in the right places, that they are kept back and out of the right places. By the very class that he condemns that they could be found in the fields behind the plow or on some lake fishing, or other backward places.

Well, although Mr. Shaw puts up a very good argument in this line, I can not agree with him. If those men and women stay in the places they occupy it is because they wish to, or they have not the ability to get higher. I would like to ask any man who is dissatisfied with this Canada of ours, where he is going to get a better or freer country to live in? I do not wish to contradict Mr. Shaw for I feel that he is right in a great many ways, but I am afraid that he will never realize his views, and if he will just stop and think he will find that the whole trouble does not lay in unions and party politics. He will find that it's more from human selfishness and no consideration for our neighbors' needs, well as our own, that causes the most of our difficulties.

I quite agree with Mr. Shaw that they are men in high places that should never be there, but the people have a remedy. They have their votes. There's no use quoting scripture to those "Seventy-Sixes." And they are not doing what is right, kick them out. If France and Great Britain had quoted scripture and prayed to Germany, what good would it have done? The only thing that brought Emperor Bill to his right senses was the British Dreadnaughts and French Seventy-Sixes. And the right remedy or what Mr. Shaw complains of is good, straight, unselfish government. A great many will say, "Can we get that?" I say we can by the press of our country taking the lead, and exposing those grafters, extortioners and shady politicians.

There's no use saying that all our laws are wrong. They are not. But it's needless to deny that some are a great deal more helpful than others. Especially in the tariff. But the people have a remedy. Let them stop and think for themselves, use their votes right and not be led away by glib-tongued politicians, as Mr. Shaw says. Let them realize their need and their neighbors' need, as well; not only think of themselves but realize that there other men and women that need a helping hand, and they will not need to pray and preach to other people. They will have plenty of time to pray for themselves. I do not want any one to think that I mean it is wrong to refer to the bible, or to pray, but what I do mean is that it is useless to quote scripture and pray to those kind of men that Mr. Shaw refers to. The only way is to use the best and most useful weapon on those men in public life who try to cheat the public. Expose them and put them where they belong. I do not believe that the trouble all lies in political parties or unions. It lies entirely in the private individual himself or herself, who will not try to think for themselves, but is only too ready to be led, never stopping to think whether it is the right way or the wrong way.
