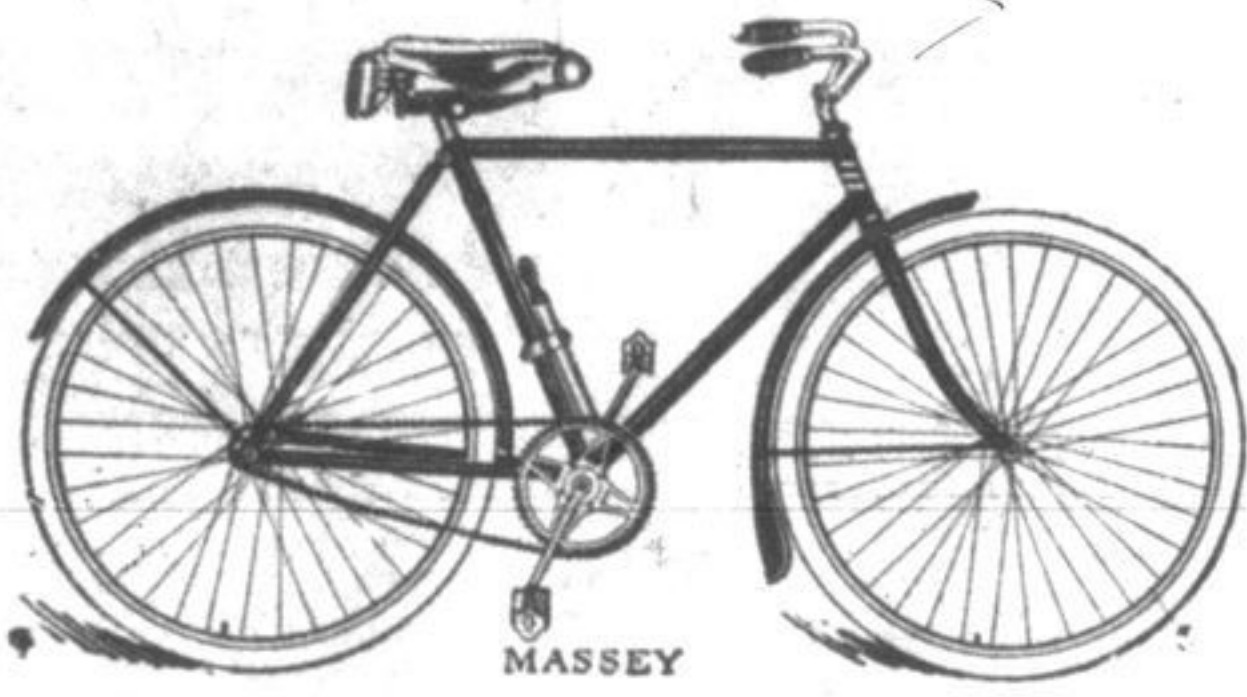


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EASTERN HATS & CAPS

Baseball Briefs

Joe Boehling's efforts to come back with the Cleveland Indians were brief. After a week spent in the camp at New Orleans he concluded his case was a hopeless one, and notified Manager Les Frazier that he'd go back to his home in Virginia and forget about baseball.

The Oakland team of the Pacific Coast League enjoys the novelty of having three men on its list who have acted as manager. They are Del Howard, present boss; Honus Witzel and Rowdy Elliott, both of whom tried leading the Oaks for a while. Jack Flynn, the former Leaf, who managed the New London team and won a pennant with it, thinks he can revive baseball there, in spite of the refusal of business men to back the club, and he has announced that he will make a canvass for supporters to save the franchise in the Eastern League.

The Kansas City Club is said to be banking on Carmen Hill as a pitcher this season, but reports from Oil City have Bill going into partnership with Ben Shaw, Pittsburg catcher, and Jake Pittler, infielder, in some sort of business or other and playing ball on the Oil City independent team for a side line.

Toronto May Get Testreau.
There is a probability that Jeff Testreau, the mammoth spit-baller, who virtually made his start with the Toronto club, may return this season. Manager Gibson has been given permission by Manager McGraw to talk business with the big fellow. "Tessie," as he is known in big league circles, was the leading twirler for several seasons, but in the last two years McGraw has not used him to any extent. He was a wonder when with the Leafs and there is no doubt but that he would prove a winner in the International League. Catcher Snyder, it is announced, has been secured from Brooklyn. He is reported to be a good backstop. If he wasn't Gibson wouldn't take him on. Being a catcher himself, the Leaf manager knows a good workman when he sees him.

Baseball in Lisbon.
Captain Armand de Mast and Adjutant-General Bramard, American military attaché here, arranged a baseball game at Lisbon between the crews of the submarine chasers Leonidas and Warrant. It was the first game ever seen in Portugal. The Leonidas club won, 16-2. President Castro was officially represented at the game, the receipts of which were given to the institute for re-education of war cripples.

CORBETT TO TRAIN DEMPSEY.

Offers Services to Challenger For World's Title.
Jim Corbett, former heavyweight champion, and the last Irishman to hold the title, has volunteered his services as trainer for Dempsey when the latter starts his heavy work for the bout with Jess Willard. It is but fitting that Corbett should lend his every assistance to help condition Dempsey. What a far cry it is from September, 1892, to July 4, 1919. It was in 1892 that Corbett did the seemingly impossible when he lowered the colors of the once invincible John L. Sullivan.
By that one battle Jim Corbett raised himself from the lowly level of a hard working clerk to that of the most talked of man in the athletic world. He has made several fortunes since that never-to-be-forgotten night in New Orleans, has always retained his great popularity, has never been other than a credit to the profession he adopted accidentally and is to-day one of the big stars of the silent drama, being featured in many motion pictures. The popularity that came to Corbett by his victory over Sullivan is already with Dempsey. On his present tour he is being idolized.

Germans Not For Olympiad.
Announcement that the International Olympic committee has chosen Antwerp for the Olympic games in 1920 by Baron Pierre de Coubertin, president of the committee, at a meeting in Lausanne, Switzerland, to celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the re-establishment of the Olympics, was applauded warmly. The baron said he had sent a telegram to the committee, King Albert of Belgium announcing the decision of the committee. Neither Great Britain, the United States nor the Central Powers were represented at the meeting this afternoon.

Baron de Coubertin denied the truth of the report that the French would refuse to participate in the next Olympiad if the Germans take part. Sporting circles here doubt that the British and Americans will enter games with the Germans and Austrians next year.
The Olympic committee is making an effort to prevent the hatred engendered by the war from ruining the sporting spirit after the war, but recognizes that it has a difficult task ahead of it.

The Vernon Club of the Pacific Coast League made a deal with the Pittsburgh Nationals for the services of infielder Jake Bitler, but the player has raised objections to going so far away from home, and the transfer is blocked for the time being. TO RETURN TO RING.

English Featherweight Saw Much Service in France.
Owen Moran, the English featherweight boxer, is back on the Pacific coast after an absence of several years. Moran was recently discharged from the army, where he held an officer's rank in the quartermasters' department. Owen has just returned from the battlefields of France. For many months he was stationed at Ypres.
Moran is in good condition and said that he would return to the ring in the near future. He weighs about 128 pounds, the weight he fought at when he met the best men of his class. The Englishman thinks that he can stand a chance with some of the present day fighters.
The last bout Moran engaged in was in London last September, when he stopped "Darky" Dolph, lightweight champion of the English army, in one round. The army life has kept Moran in good physical trim and he is anxious to take another whirl in the boxing game.

Canada May Enter Race.
At the meeting of the Henley Regatta Committee it was announced that the King will present a special trophy for the race for eights for crews from the Allied forces, which will be decided at the Henley Regatta on July 4 and 5. The King's cup will undoubtedly add to the interest in the racing, and it is anticipated that in addition to Great Britain entries will be made by Australia, Canada, New Zealand and possibly by the United States, France and Belgium.

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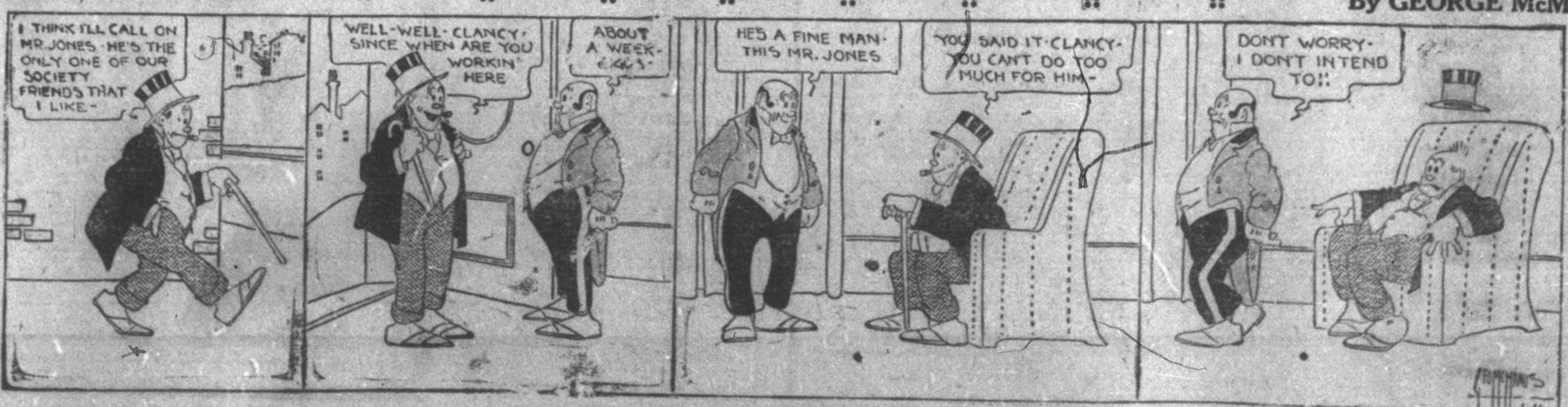
