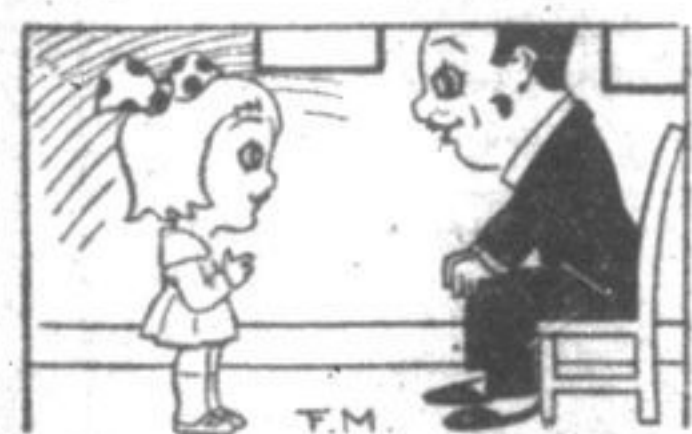
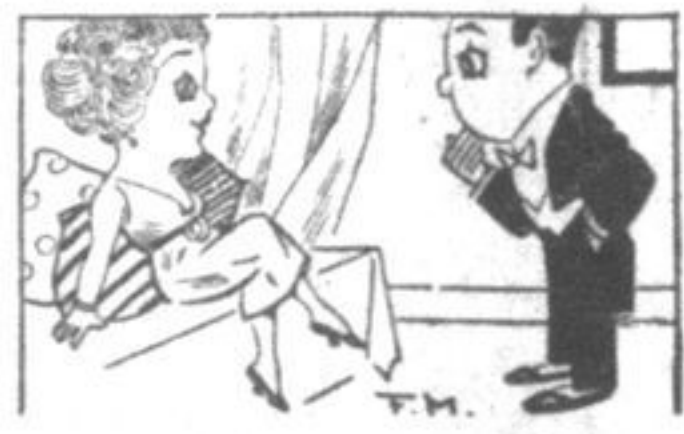

PHILADELPHIA GIRL SENSATIONAL SWIMMER

Elizabeth Ryan, the sensational young swimmer of the 1st Regiment swimming team of Philadelphia, is one of the first to send in her entry for the 500-yard national championship Amateur Athletic Union race for women, which will be held at the water pool at Brighton Beach, April 19th. This event will inaugurate the spring and summer season at the pool.

Miss Ryan has only been competing for two and a half years. She is eighteen. Her record in the water is remarkable. She has participated in fifty-seven races, being placed fifty-four times, a performance never surpassed by any girl swimmer in the world.

In Philadelphia she is regarded as a marvel. She is the holder of the 220-yard indoor middle Atlantic States A.A.U. championship. She defeated Olga Dorg Forfaer outdoors at this distance for that district last summer.

It was only recently that she won the middle Atlantic states 100-yard championship in 1.09. The National Women's Swimming Association, which is conducting the 500-yard event, is making an effort to obtain an entry from Claire Galligan of New Rochelle, who is national champion at all distances from 440 yards to five miles. She announced her retirement from competition upon her marriage last fall, after breaking numerous records. She has been racing six years.

It is said that Miss Galligan is training under the watchful eye of Louis De B. Handley, and if she can get back into her former condition will defend her title for the last time before leaving for the west, where she will make her home with her sailor boy husband.

Like Lepers.
Germans, Austrians, Turks and Bulgarians have been expelled from the International Cycling Union. This was decided at the first meeting of the international cycling body that has been held in four years. It convened at Paris recently and decided unanimously not to permit entries from any of the Central Powers. The charters of all the allied cycling organizations of the Central Powers were cancelled.

This means that Walter Rutt, of Berlin, who won the last competition for the world's sprint championship, will not defend the title he won at Leipzig, Germany, in 1913. The embargo on riders of the Central Powers is for an "indefinite period."

No American or German delegates were at the meeting, which was representative of only England, France, Belgium, Switzerland and Italy. The cycling ranks of France were thinned by the war, while the leading riders of Germany were instructors in motorcycle corps.

Trapsshooters' Early Start.
American trapsshooters are the first of that nation's amateur sportsmen to make official plans for competing in the 1920 Olympic games to be held at Antwerp. The Secretary of the American Traps Shooting Association, announced that the high ten men in the official averages on 2,000 or more registered targets shot at this year, would form the team of trapsshooters.

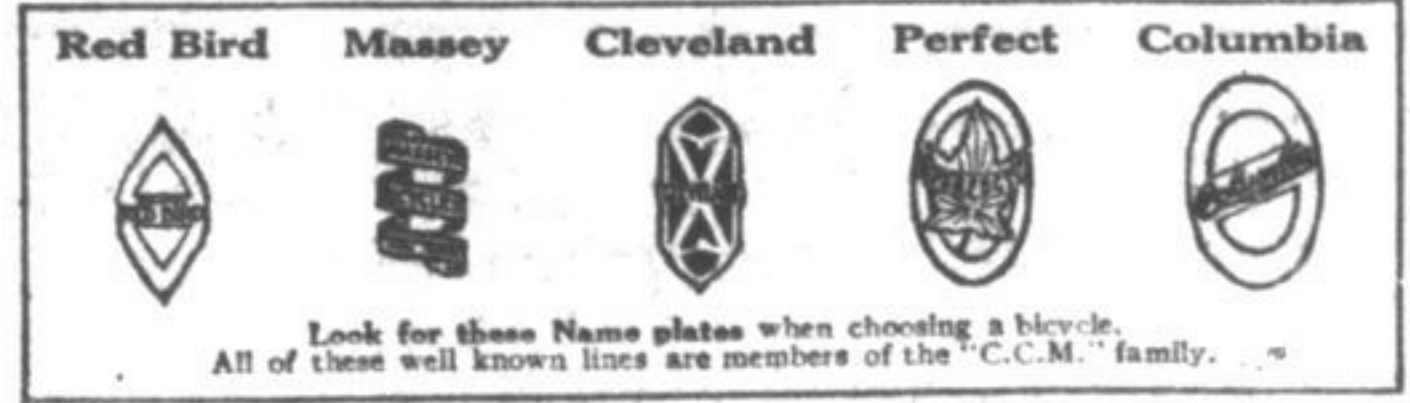
