ERECTION OF NEW SCHOOL ENTITLED TO A GOOD JOB

BOARD OF EDUCATION ARRANGE TO ENGAGE ARCHITECTS

Clerk of Works to Be Employed to Supervise Construction of Building—Contract to Be Drawn Up for Architects.

Matters regarding the building of the proposed new school for Cataraqui ward were advanced another stage on Tuesday night, when the Board of Education, at a special meeting, arranged for the services of architects and at the same time made arrangements for other details.

The property committee, through its chairman, Trustee W. H. Godwin, presented a report recommending the appointing of Power & Drever, of this city, as architects. The report was adopted with some amendments as follows:

That Messrs Power & Drever be appointed architects for the proposed new ten-room school building, at a round fee of \$2,500, this amount to cover the cost of architects' services up to a total expenditure for the building of \$75,000; if the work does not go on this year the Board to be at no expense for the plans and specifications; but when the work is proceeded with the Board to feel in duty bound to engage the services of architects on the above terms. The architects to agree in writing to give close supervision of the work during the course of construction, and to perform their duties under the property committee of the Board.

"That in the event of the construction of the school being proceeded with, a clerk of works be employed to supervise the construction of the school, said clerk to be solely under the supervision of, and responsible to the Board, and that the agreement between the Board and the architect embody such provision.

"That the architect be instructed to have a member of their firm visit Toronto with School Inspector J. Russell Smart, and inspect the new schools before proceeding with the plans for the proposed school.

"That J. L. Whiting be employed to prepare a contract between the Board and the architect, carrying out the terms above set forth.

In presenting this report, Trustee Godwin stated that the committee had interviewed Messrs Power and Drever and they were willing to agree to the terms as specified in the report.

"I do not think that we can do better than to employ them," said Trustee Godwin.

Trustee Renton asked for information regarding the estimated cost of the new school.

Trustee Godwin, in reply, stated that it was up to the Board to finally decide on the number of rooms for the new school. For a ten-room school the estimated cost was \$70,000, exclusive of the site.

The chairman, F. R. Anglin, presided at the meeting, and the other members present were Trustees Craig, Cohen, J. B. Cooke, Elliott, Farrell, Godwin, Henderson, Mills, McLean, Renton, Sawyer and Lockett.

A SPLENDID TREAT.

He says he will never be a sport again. He is fifty-four years of age, a man of muscular development and has physical agility like a rubber ball. His words are as fresh as the salt of the ocean and anyone who wants to know what the British seaman is going to do to the Hun in the next six or seven years should not fail to hear him on Thursday evening. BUT NOTHING MORE IF IN FIT CONDITION.

James S. Macdonnell Tells Toronto Veterans He is Opposed to Excessive Demands Made on the Government.

Major J. B. Macdonnell, M.C., Croix de Guerre and Italian Cross, was elected second vice-president of the central branch of the Great War Veterans' Association, Toronto.

Regarding him the Toronto Telegram says: "The very arguments, dealing with a returned soldier's fair inheritance from the country, that were received at the last meeting, were again enunciated by Comrade Macdonnell as the course he should support were he elected. He spoke on a proposition contained in a motion from the west, in which the Government was asked to consider the following gratuities: \$2,000 for the active service man; \$1,500 for the man who served in England; and \$1,000 for the man who served in Canada."

He declared that such a scheme would cost the Government \$750,000,000.

"That is \$150,000,000 less than this year's revenue," said the speaker. "If I were the Government I would not give a cent to the healthy fellow who is able to get back as decent a job as he had before; we shall have the country bankrupt," was his contention.

"With the widows and orphans, the maimed and shellshocked, who have been decently treated there won't be much left for the fellows who come back in fit condition. They have the right to a good job, nothing else. They cannot be paid in hard cash for the service they have given, and as for being subsidized for the rest of our lives, I don't believe in it, and if you elect me I shall vote against it."

Major Macdonnell is a son of G. M. Macdonnell, K.C., Kingston, and is a young Toronto lawyer.

SEEKING FREEDOM FROM TRADE RESTRAINT

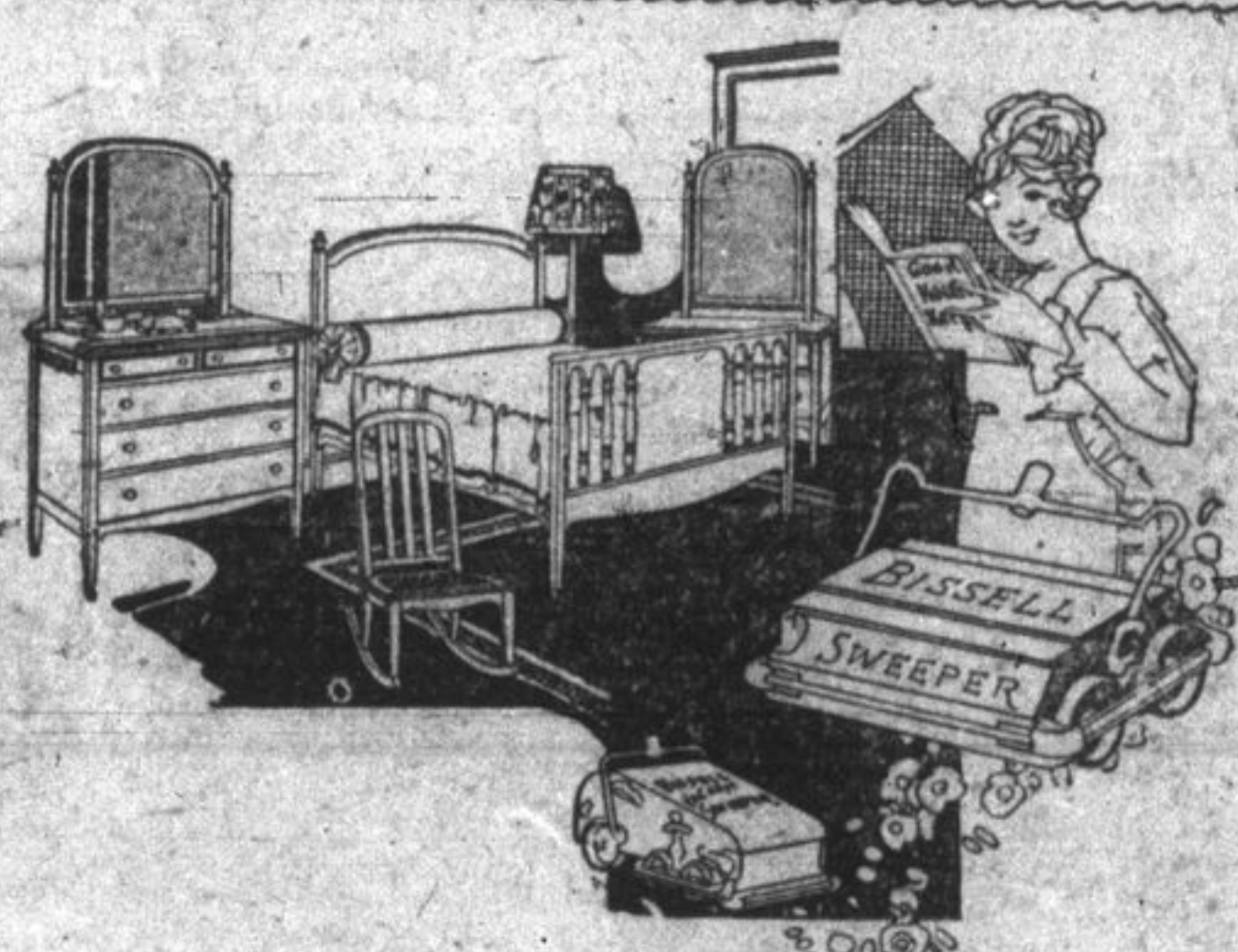
