MAJOR SHARPE'S SENTENCE. Given Two Years in Prison, But Reduced to One Year. Major W. J. S. Sharpe has been cashiered for desertion, and in addition must serve one year's imprisonment at Burwash. The court martial sentenced him to two years' imprisonment, but one year has been remitted by the government. This information was given out at military headquarters Thursday morning. Dressed in civilian clothes, the prisoner left to-day in the custody of a constable for the Burwash prison farm, where he is to serve out the sentence. He will have to serve the whole term unless there is a further exercise of executive clemency.
