An Advance of Fifty Cents a Ton Now Imposed Locally. Coal in Kingston is now selling at \$12 a ton, an advance of fifty cents over the price which prevailed all winter. The advance has been general and is blamed by the dealers on

the cost of production. All winter the price has been \$11.50, but recently the price charged by the coal companies from which the dealers buy their supply, jumped fifty-five cents a ton. This in turn was passed on and the consumer now has another half a dollar to pay
