REPORT REGARDING SERVICE GRATUITIES

Over Eighty-nine Thousand Cheques Issued Up to April 25th.

Ottawa, May 1 .- The following information is issued by the Department of Militia with a view to clearing up existing difficulties regarding soldiers' war service gratuities.

The statutory declaration must be forwarded through the district paymaster of the militury district in which the applicant was discharged, after a certificate has been attached showing the amount of post discharge pay already paid.

Up to April 25th there have been IN REVENUE AND AMOUNT MUST received 53,831 applications for war service gratuity from those struck off the strength, prior to the 11th of November, 1918. Of these 2,800 have been received since April 1st, and to date, 89,190 cheques have been issued, of which 34,841 cheques represent the first payment to soldiers and their dependents, 25,104 the second payment, 25,104 the third payment and 1,600 the fourth pay-
