WHAT GERMANY SOUGHT

TERMS ERZBERGER WAS IN FAVOR OF IMPOSING.

Would Have Wiped Out neutrals and Freed Herself from the Leading Strings of England. Paris, May 2.—The terms that Mathias Erzberger was in favor of imposing upon the Allies if Germany had been victorious, as set forth in a memorandum written by him in 1914, are outlined by a Geneva despatch to the Journal, having been received at Geneva from the private secretary of the late Kurt Eisner, the former Bavarian Premier. "Germany, in the first place, cannot tolerate the presence on her frontiers of so-called neutral states insufficiently strong to preserve their neutrality or which do not want to remain neutral," said Erzberger. "Her second aim must be to free herself from the insupportable leading strings of England on all questions of world policy. In the third place, she must break up the Russian colossus. "Consequently Germany must have sovereignty, not only over Belgium, but the French coast from Dunkirk to Boulogne, and possessions of the Channel Islands. She must also take the mines in French Lorraine and create an African German Empire by annexing the Belgian and French Congo, British Nigeria, Dahomey and the French west coast. "In fixing indemnities, the actual capacity of a state at the moment should not be considered. Besides a large immediate payment, annual installments spread over a long period could be arranged. France would be helped in making them by decreasing her budget of naval and military appropriations, the reductions to be imposed in the peace treaty being such as would enable her to send substantial sums to Germany. Indemnities should provide for the repayment of the full cost of the war and the damage of war, notably in East Prussia; the redemption of all of Germany's public debt and the creation of a vast fund for incapacitated soldiers."

ADDRESS AT CONVOCATION

It is to my mind even more important that the British Empire and the United States are largely governed by the Common Law of England, for the fact that we have common ideals of justice is the true basis of the unity of the English-speaking peoples, upon which in reality depends the advancement of civilization, in truth its very security. The great Charter of Liberty was achieved before the division of the English-speaking peoples and its main provisions have been perpetuated in the constitution of the United States. The living principles of justice and liberty embodied in that great constitutional document are the precious heritage of the English-speaking peoples, for which we fought in the Great War, and which we must hand on unimpaired and undiminished to our children and children's children. While we enjoy the inestimable blessings of British liberty safeguarded by the "peaceful reign of good law," it is necessary to guard them, and of late years there have been certain tendencies which at one time threatened to destroy individual liberty which is the fundamental basis of British institutions. Men of science tell us that no two human beings ever have been, or will be, exactly alike, and it would be the most fatal thing that could happen the human race to enforce a dull and deadly uniformity. Fortunately the British Constitution and the Common Law of England, are living and capable of growth, capable of being adapted to all the needs and justice-loving peoples.

We are too apt to disregard the warning of Shakespeare that the insolence of office is one of the most grievous ills to which flesh is heir, and to overlook on his profound knowledge of human nature, that, when vested with arbitrary powers, the typical official—"Dressed in a little brief authority, most ignorant of what he is most assured... plays such fantastic tricks before high heaven as make the angels weep."

Many thoughtful persons view with alarm the growing custom of vesting in irresponsible bodies legislative as well as administrative powers and making their arbitrary decisions above the law—not subject to appeal, as the phrase is. After a long fight it was established that even the King was not above the law and our forefathers abolished one Star Chamber. This generation is multiplying Star Chambers, when they become too oppressive and tyrannical, as most certainly they will, they can in turn be abolished.

While the mischief done will be annoying, I do not believe that in any case it will be fatal. The living principles of liberty and justice embodied in the English Common Law and in the British Constitution have enabled our race to survive many dangers in the past and I, at any rate, have no doubt they still have sufficient vitality to ensure we shall overcome the grave perils which menace our future. In this, as in many other regards, there will be what is popularly described as the swing of the pendulum of you.

Many of her sons gladly laid down their bright young lives, "their fairest gift of a lover's devotion" to the sacred cause of liberty. Of them we may use the immortal words of Pericles, spoken long years ago in praise of the fallen heroes of Athens: "But each one, man by man, has earned an imperishable praise, each has gained a glorious grave—not that sepulchre of earth wherein they lie, but the living tomb of everlasting remembrance that will live on the lips, that will blossom in the deeds of their countrymen the world over. For the whole earth is the sepulchre of heroes; monuments may rise and tablets be set up to them in their own land; but on far-off shores there is an abiding memorial that no pen or chisel has traced; it is graven, not on stone or brass, but on the living heart of humanity. Take these men then for your examples. Like them, remember that prosperity can only be for the free, that freedom is the sure possession of those alone who have courage to defend it."

Anxious for Canadian Trade. The economic commission has been holding a series of meetings with the Siberian Supply Company and the agents of the Canadian Government, and are endeavoring to reach an equitable basis for Siberian trade. At a recent conference there were representatives present of cooperative organizations who expressed an eagerness to develop business relations with Canada owing to the similarity of climate and resources, and also because of successful cooperative movements among the farmers of the Dominion. Canada, furthermore, is without selfish aims; an unwillingness is expressed in the matter of trading through middlemen. Trade, if trade is to be had, is wanted direct. It is realized that it is impossible to develop trade right now owing to the transportation difficulties and the political instability of the country, but in the meantime people in Siberia are anxious to learn modern Canadian methods and are sending representatives to Canada shortly to study the methods.

A recent despatch represents it as a distemper, which may have been caused originally "by putting a few blades of grass in the mouth when walking in the fields."

Washing Fluid Recipe. The following will be found an excellent washing fluid: Five pounds of washing soda, one gallon of cold water, put to boil.
