ARE HINTED AT BY THE UTILITIES COMMISSION.

Cost of Pumping At Waterworks Cut In Two—Two Houses On Barrack Street to Be Sold and Removed.

The Utilities Commission met on Monday afternoon with R. F. Elliott (chairman), Mayor Newman and Thomas Hewitt in attendance.

The commission decided to call for tenders for the purchase and removal of two small houses it owns on Barrack street as it wishes the land for the new gas purifier.

A by-law relating to the duties of the civil officials in connection with the utilities departments was read but left over till next meeting when Mr. Chown and Mr. Rigney will likely be present.

The laying of a new gas main in Princess street between Barrie and Division, owing to the paving to be done, was authorized. The cost will be \$1,525.

In reply to Mayor Newman Mr. Hewitt stated that the cost of pumping at the waterworks station had been cut in two by the installation of the electric pump.

Manager Folger reported that since the first of the year eighty-nine new electric meters had been installed for consumers.

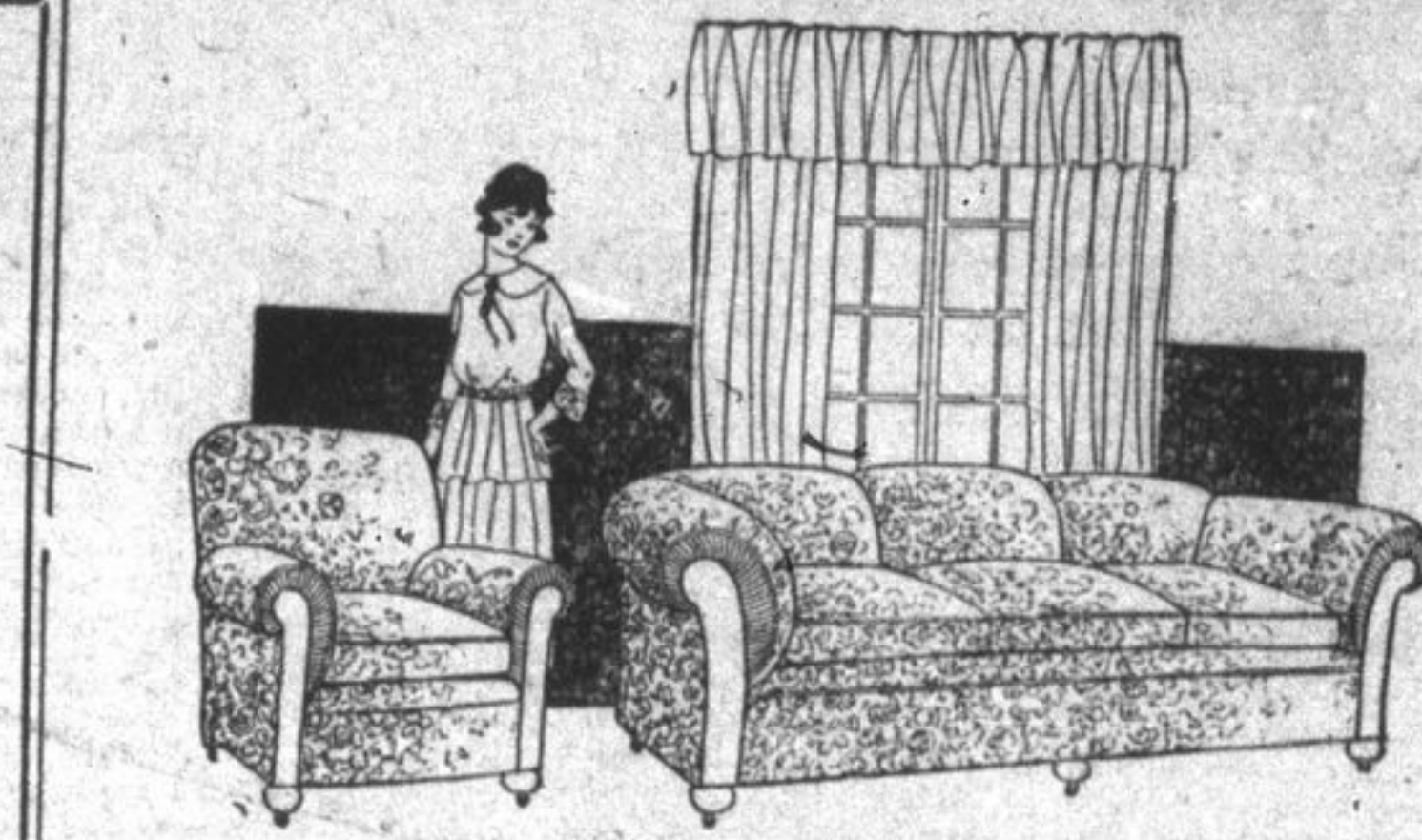
