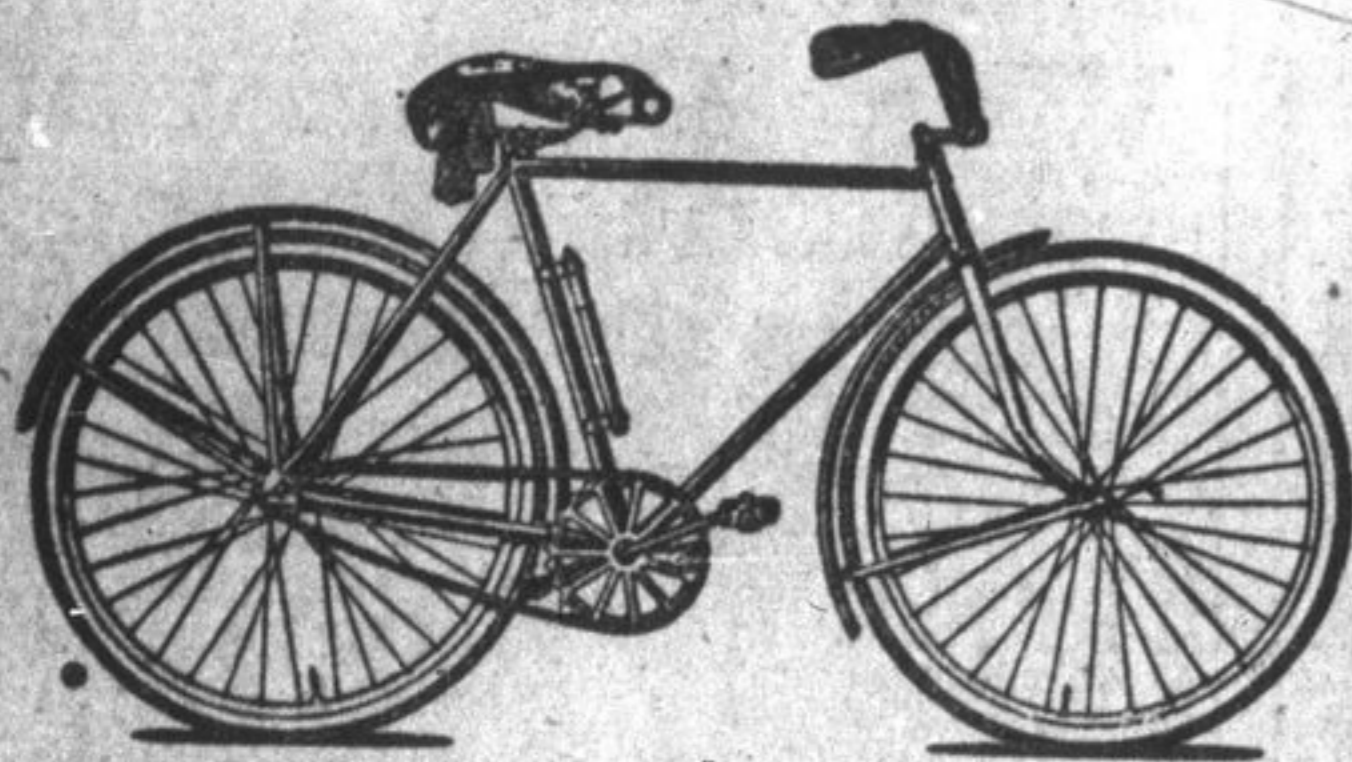

In the World of Sport

EXTENSIVE TRAINING FOR QUEEN'S TEAMS

The University Athletes Will Be Put Through a Thorough System.

With the appointment of "Jack" Williams as coach and James Bews as trainer of Queen's athletes during next season, which commenced in the fall, the plans for training are being made.

It is estimated that about fifty students will be in the hands of the two officials. These will be the choice of the university as its athletic representatives and an intensive system of training to make them as good as possible will be started. The season will likely commence at the opening of the university in the fall, and from then until the season closes in 1920 the students will be under rigid training orders. They will probably sleep and eat at the university, and start their training every morning at six o'clock and continue until the afternoon, with interruption only for classes and study hours. Players who wish to enter into any line of sport, whether rugby, hockey or even tennis, will have to train in this way. The plans call for the production of winning teams in every line of sport.

Which is Better Drawing Card?

There is now some discussion as to which is the greater baseball drawing card, Ty Cobb or Babe Ruth, with quite a number favoring Ruth, largely on the strength of his prodigious beginning of the season with home runs. It seems too bad to Ruth's admirers that his home runs in two days against the Orioles, of Baltimore—five of them in succession—could not have been made in a regular league game instead of an exhibition. However, six home runs in eight times up, in the old times being passes for the Babe, practically makes a sequence of six home runs in six times at the bat, which is unprecedented in baseball history. However, it is pointed out that Ruth's performance has been somewhat approximately. In the old days Bobby Lowe, with the Boston National team, at Boston, May 30th, 1894, cracked out four homers (two in one inning) and a single while Elton Chamberlain was in the pitcher's box for Cincinnati. "Big" Ed DeLoachy, of the Phillies, July 13, 1896, at Chicago, made four home runs and at a single off Pitcher Terry, Dan Brouthers, Detroit, N.L., is also credited with four home runs in a single game.

Butler to Race No More.

Captain Everard Butler, former Canadian and American champion sculler, and aspirant for the Diamond Sculls, has, owing to injuries received while on overseas service, announced his retirement.

Butler went to England in 1916 as Paymaster with the 12th Artillery Brigade, and later went to France with the 3rd Machine Gun Battalion. He received severe injuries and was shell-shocked, and is now in only fair health. While in England he was asked to participate in the allied championship race, to be held on the Thames in July, but his injuries prevented him from accepting.

With reference to the Canadian eight, now in England, Butler says they are coached by Patterson of Vancouver and that four Ottawa oarsmen, but no Toronto men, are in the boat.

Butler won the Canadian and American sculling titles in 1910 and 1911. At that time he was at his best, and, in passing up his oars and shells, the Argonauts lose their premier sculler and one of their finest sportsmen.

Moran's Success Talk of Baseball.

Pat Moran's success with the Cincinnati team is the talk of baseball. A week before the season started the Reds looked to be wrecked beyond repair. They had hold-outs, injured players and a training trip that was disastrous. With his usual indomitable courage, the "Pie" discarded leader started work. He traded Leo Magee, a temperamental player, for hard-working Larry Kopf; worked hard with his pitchers, promoted team-work and soon had a winning combination. For the first time in many years, Cincinnati has a manager who can win them games on the coach lines. Pat Moran's quick transformation of the Reds into winners represents the highest attributes of a baseball general.

Sport Notes.

"Jim" Vaughn of the Chicago Nationals has had a checkered career. For eight years, and with as many different clubs, he was considered a failure, but in the ninth when he joined the Cubs he immediately became one of the best and most dependable twirlers in the game, and has continued at the same pace during the past five years.

"Babe" Ruth, the demon slugger of the Boston Americans, has many physical advantages. He is twenty-five years of age, is 5 feet 2 inches tall and weighs 209 pounds. He is remarkably fast on his feet and can throw a baseball as fast as any living player, and it is said of him that he is the hardest hitter the game has ever produced.

Giants May Land Rudolph.

There has been much conjecture as to what disposal McGraw of the New York Giants will make of Robertson, having plenty of outfielders. It was rumored that an exchange of Robertson for Rudolph was more likely. There is a revival, too, of the three-cornered deal talk—Robertson to Washington, Lavan to the Cardinals and Gonzales to the Giants—but it was agreed the outlook for that is no better now than during the winter, when the transaction fell through because Dreyfuss, of Pittsburg, wouldn't waive on Robertson.

Flocking to the Giants

The New York National League Club has announced that Pitcher William Perritt, who has refused to report to the club all spring, has accepted terms and left his home in Shreveport, La., to join the team. Dave Robertson, former right fielder of the club, who has not played ball since the 1917 season, will report to the New York Club to-morrow. It is understood here that Robertson will be used by McGraw in a trade.

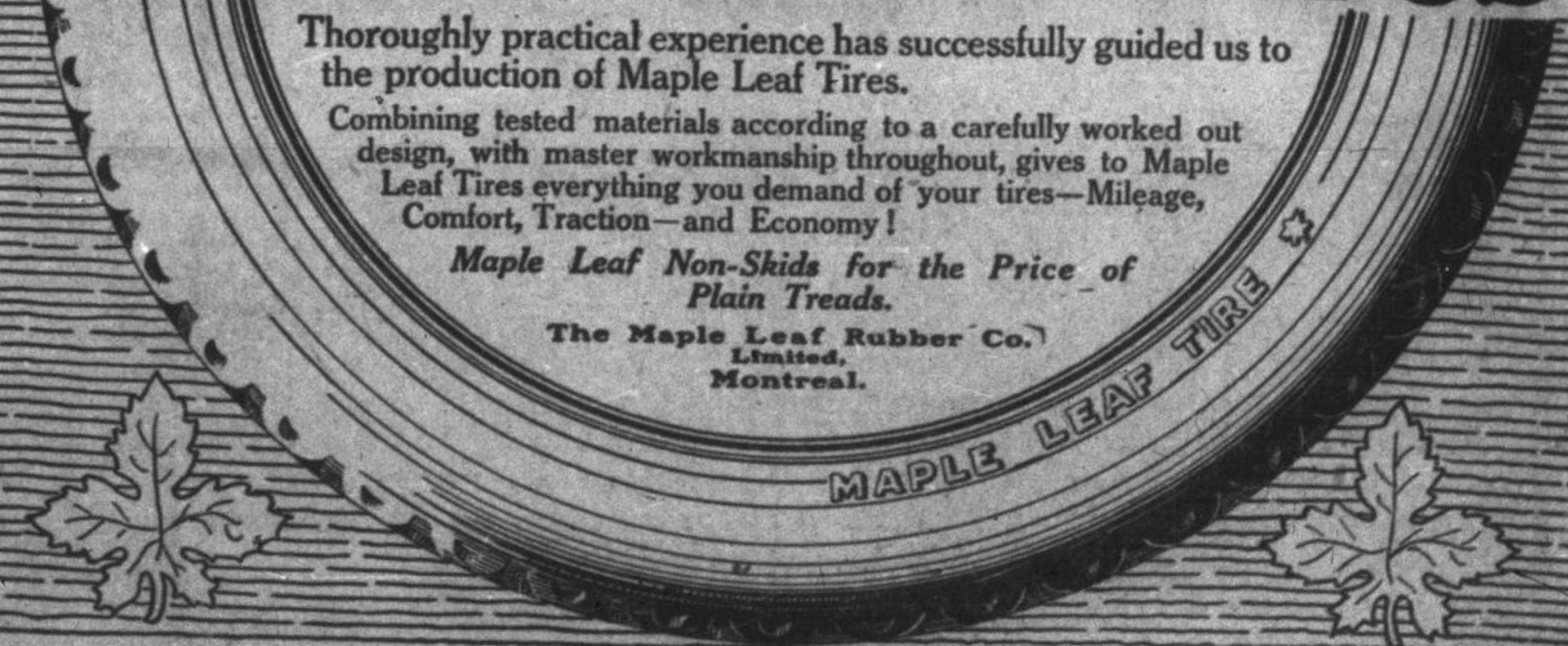
