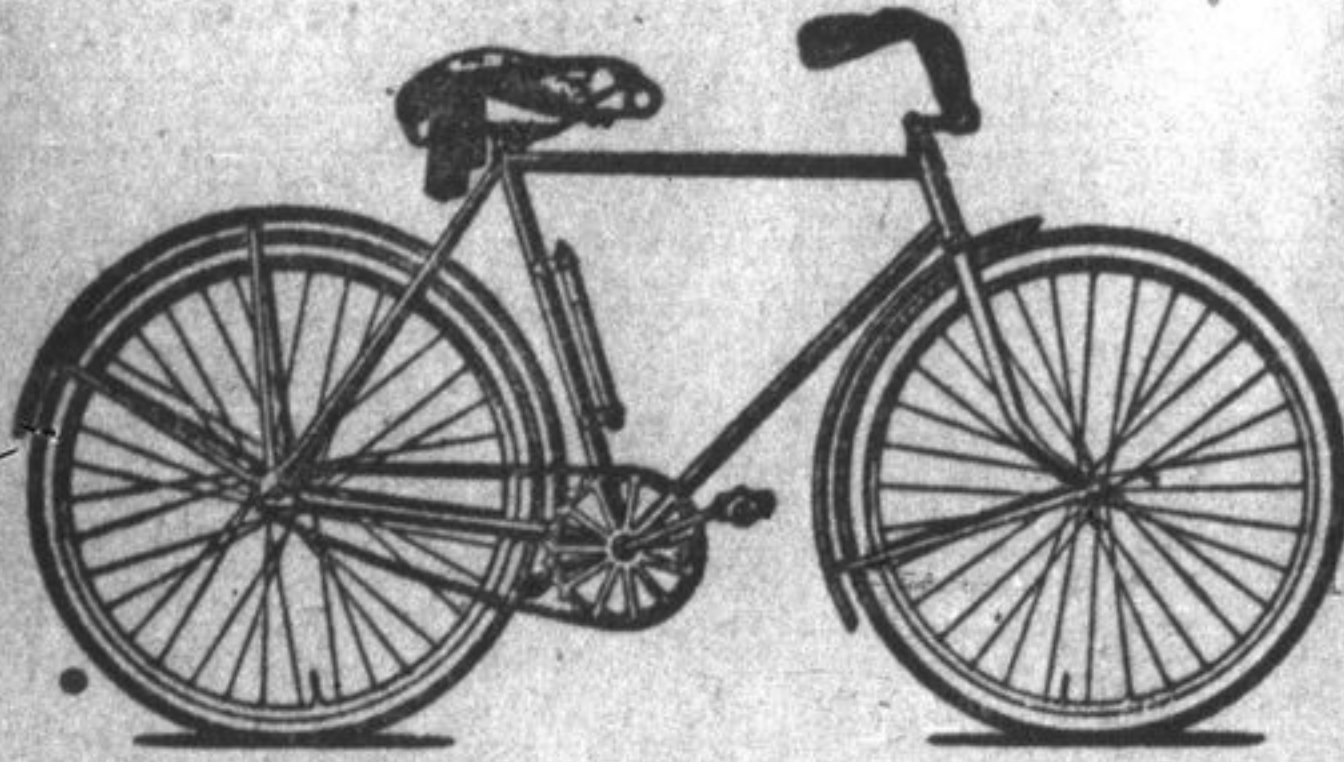

LAWN BOWLING MEETING

PRESCOTT IS THE PLACE FOR ANNUAL TOURNAMENT.

The Officers Chosen For the Ensuing Year—Some Kind Words Were Expressed By the Visitors.

A most enthusiastic meeting of the St. Lawrence Lawn Bowling Association was held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall on Wednesday afternoon. The business included the election of officers for the current year and the naming of the place for the annual tournament. Prescott was chosen.

W. H. Wormwith, the president, occupied the chair. H. W. Newman, mayor, who was secretary-treasurer, welcomed the delegates to the city with his customary warmth.

The secretary-treasurer reported a balance of \$139, which was most satisfactory. The Belleville club was admitted to membership and the representatives, C. N. Sulman and W. B. Riggs, were accepted on the executive committee. A resolution was passed placing the part of the province from Belleville east, under the jurisdiction of the Association, but teams from points outside would be admitted to the tournament.

The following officers were elected: Honorary presidents, Hon. J. D. Reid, A. E. Donevan, M.P.P., Isaac P. Wiser, Hon. G. F. Graham, Senator J. Webster, W. F. Nickle, V.P., J. L. Payne, J. R. Dargavel, M.P.P., President, R. M. Keller, Prescott; vice-president, Harry White, Brockville; secretary-treasurer, W. J. Ranson, Prescott; Executive committee, D. W. Downey, Brockville; Dr. Kidd, Eastern Hospital, Brockville; E. D. Higgins, Prescott; Dr. R. E. Cartwright, Kingston; Dr. Hutl, Chesterville; R. R. Farrow and R. Morley, Ottawa; T. Phelan, Highland Park, Ottawa; E. A. Thomas, Civil Service, Ottawa; W. B. Riggs, Belleville.

The annual tournament is to be held at Prescott, commencing at 2 p.m., July 14th.

R. M. Keller, the new president, thanked the meeting for his election and expressed the hope that the year 1919 would be a most successful one for the Association. He extended a hearty invitation to all to come to Prescott where, he said, they would receive the best possible entertainment. Mr. Riggs thanked the executive for the reception accorded the Belleville club's representatives. They captured a trophy last year and were anxious to defend it this year.

PREPARING AT TOLEDO.

For the Willard Dempsey Fight On July 4th.

Under the Ohio law, the Mayor of Toledo is permitted to grant consent for the Willard-Dempsey fight. Under decision of the court one is privileged to employ boxers and give exhibitions when a purse is not competed for.

An octagon-shaped arena to accommodate between fifty and sixty thousand spectators will be erected at a point convenient to the city. Administration charges will range from five to fifty dollars, according to the location of the seats. Both boxers will train for at least six weeks at the scene of the contest, in accordance with the terms of the contract made with Rickard.

Governor James M. Cox of Ohio, commenting on the bout, to be held at Toledo, said the law against boxing leaves its interpretation and enforcement to local officials. This was taken to mean he will not interfere.

The law permits boxing exhibitions for which the mayor, if in municipalities, or the sheriff, if outside, grants permits, if the matches are given under the auspices of a chartered athletic association, and if no purse is offered to the winner.

It is said that in the Willard-Dempsey contest no purse is to be offered, but that each contestant is to receive a definite amount of Liberty bonds. The athletic association requirements also are said to have been complied with.

Governor Cox received a telegram from J. Drexell Biddle of the Board of Boxing Commissioners of the Army and Navy, urging that the Willard-Dempsey bout be permitted in the interests of clean sport.

The Toledo Ministerial Association, composed of 150 pastors of churches in the district, held a mass meeting and protested against holding the Willard-Dempsey contest on July 4th. The union adopted a resolution condemning the bout as being in violation of State laws and those of humanity. It was resolved that every effort will be made to influence the Governor to prohibit the contest, and if necessary a delegation will be at the ringside to demand action by the County Sheriff. The meeting of ministers was called after word came that Tex Rickard had decided upon Toledo as the site of the bout.

ONTARIO LAWN BOWLING.

Saskatoon Sending Five Rinks for Tourney.

An evidence of the popularity of the Ontario Bowling Association annual tournament is the proposal of the Saskatoon Bowling Club to send five rinks to Niagara during the above tournament, which is to be held during the week of July 7th.

The westerners will travel in a special car and promise to provide a lively time for the staid old-fashioned players of the far east, and threaten to take back with them the thirty-year-old blue ribbon of lawn bowling.

The tournament will be held on the same historic grounds of the Queen's Royal Hotel at Niagara, and the entry promises to be larger than ever before, as the coming of peace has stimulated the gentle sport of bowling to an unexpected degree.
