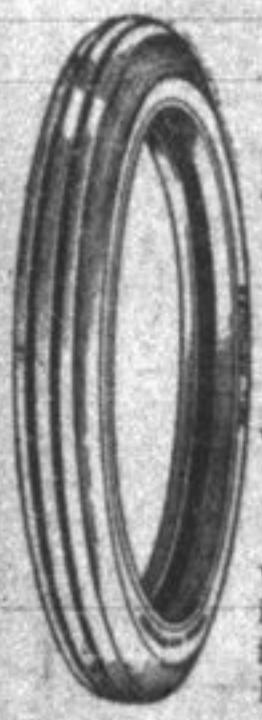

THE 21ST CLUB PREPARING

FOR THE HOMECOMING OF THE NOTED BATTALION.

Arrangements For the Big Banquet—Five Hundred Subscriptions of One Dollar Each Are Requested.

The meeting room at the G.W.V.A. rooms was filled to overflowing when the 21st Battalion Club met on Thursday evening. Comrade A. Tugwood, vice-president occupied the chair. The treasurer's report showed the club's finances to be in a healthy condition. The main business of the evening was the arranging for the big banquet to be held on the return of the unit from overseas.

The management committee reported that eleven women's organizations were to help in carrying out the plans, and were to look after the tables. An arrangement has been made whereby the banquet will be held in the armouries, which will be specially decorated for the occasion. A guest and toast list has been prepared and Sir Sam Hughes is expected to be one of the speakers.

The report of the finance committee was received with much enthusiasm. It was reported that over \$550 had been secured, and that the canvassers were meeting with a great reception. It was suggested that an appeal be made for five hundred donations of one dollar or over that a larger number of citizens could have a share in the banquet. This was adopted and \$35 was contributed by members to start this off.

A member of the club was appointed to go to Montreal to meet the battalion in order to give each man his invitation personally. Comrade Hood requested to be temporarily relieved of the duties of chairman of the entertainment committee, owing to poor health, and this was granted.

The secretary announced that he had made arrangements to have members not in possession of uniforms supplied with these on the day of the unit's arrival in Kingston. Capt. McCully was appointed to command the guard of honor for the civic parade.

The formation of baseball and football teams was approved of, and these will probably play in the military "V" league.

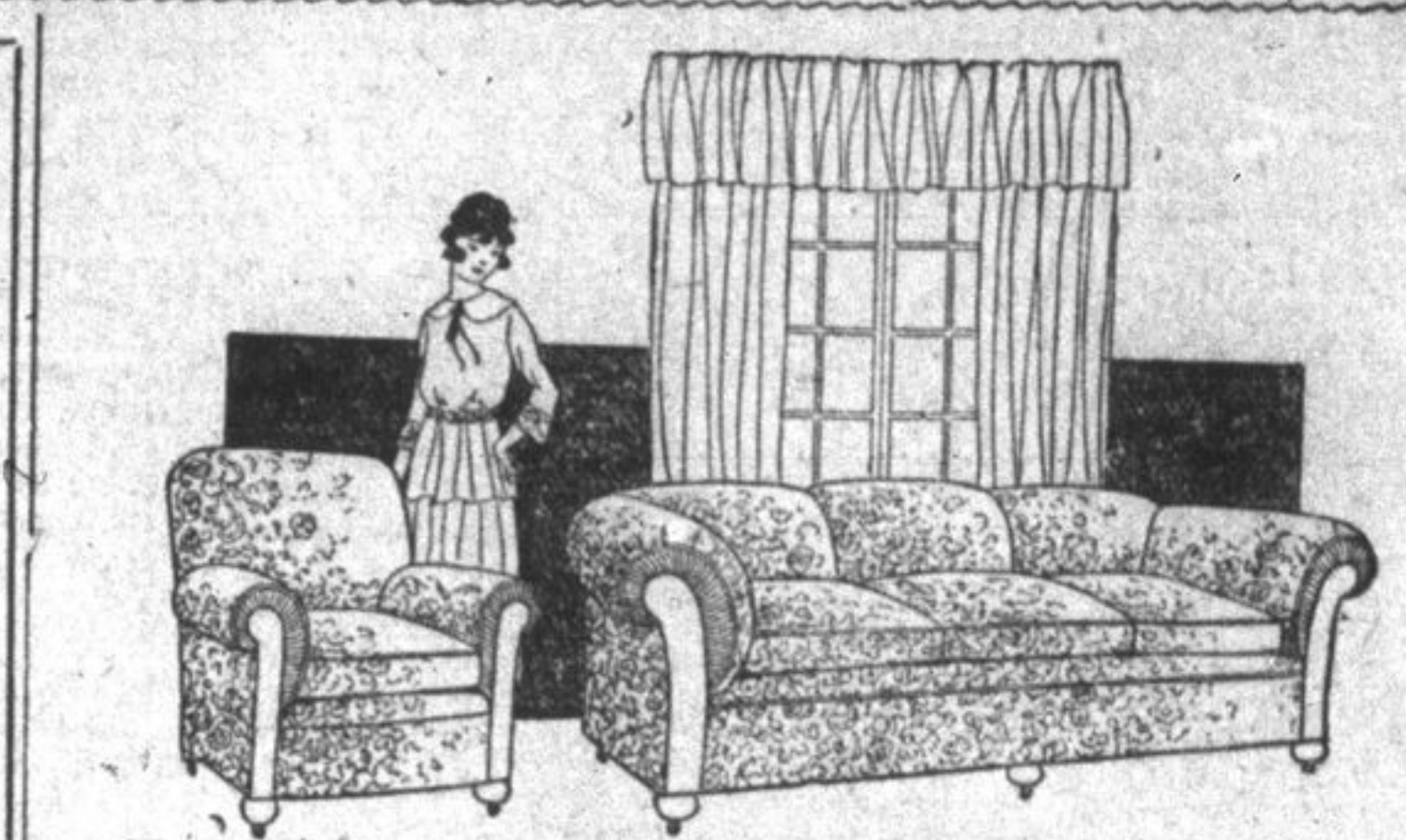
