### SEEK BETTER TRAFFIC LAW

KINGSTON MOTOR CLUB HAS SUBMITTED A BY-LAW.

Contains Most Advanced Ideas on Traffic Regulation—Club Will Have a Vigilance Committee.

That the Kingston Motor Club will be a very aggressive organization in the city during the summer months is anticipated by those who have been taking part in its activities during the past few weeks. Considerable organization work has already been accomplished, and every effort is being made to build up a strong association for the protection of motoring interests in the city. Besides securing several hundred road signs, which are to be placed on roads throughout the district by members of the club, a draft traffic regulation by-law has been framed and it is probable that it will be considered at the next meeting of the board of works.

The by-law contains the most advanced ideas on traffic regulation which could be secured by an examination of the rules in force in Canada and the United States, and will prove of interest with its contents are published. Some of the more important provisions deal with the parking of cars, the question of permitting turning on Princess street and kindred points.

The members of the club are enthusiastic for its success, and it is their aim that traffic regulation in Kingston shall be as conducive to the maintenance of pedestrian rights as those of the motorists. It is believed that the traffic by-law now in force has outgrown its usefulness with the tremendous increase in motor traffic, and that it is time that the council should have some sort of advanced ideas brought before them for their serious consideration. No attempt is being made to force through a scheme which would disregard the rights of others, and various points will be explained if necessary in order that their advantage to the city may be recognized.

The club has determined that the great majority of the city's motorists shall obey the law, and for that reason it is desirable that the law should be up to date. As most of the motorists, including many of the leading citizens, are members of the club, it is felt that the organization will do much good. Efforts will be made to obey the spirit as well as the letter of the law, and it is probable that a vigilance committee will endeavor to prevent any actions which would tend to bring the great body of motorists into disrepute. Those who are found speeding will be informed of their misdemeanor, and others who disregard the rules will be asked to refrain from actions which would injure the reputation of Kingston motorists as law abiding citizens.

The Kingston Motor Club is a co-operative, mutual aid association, and as such it will endeavor to act for the best interests not only of the members of the motorist fraternity, which is rapidly swelling in numbers, but for the interests of the general public as well.

### MAKING GOOD PROGRESS.

Kingston's Symphony Orchestra is rounding into shape. The Kingston symphony orchestra is making wonderful progress under the able direction of Oscar F. Teigmans. Weekly practice is held in the Y.M.C.A. parlors and the composition of the orchestra shows that there is a great deal of musical talent in Kingston. Thirty-five people attend the rehearsals and it is expected that the complete orchestra will include sixty instruments.

The success of the undertaking is due to the initiative of several well-known citizens, W. G. Craig, O. V. Bartels, J. W. Fraser, Profs. Eaton and Gummer, of Queen's, and Mr. Brooks, of the R.C.H.A. A large number of young ladies are receiving instruction on the violin and the enthusiasm shown by all who are taking part is likely to give permanence to the organization, which is a purely voluntary one.

The orchestra will make its first public appearance at a grand concert to be given some time in June, and music lovers are looking forward to a great treat.

A meeting of the Military Baseball League was held at the Y.M.C.A. on Wednesday evening, and a committee was appointed to draft the schedule for the coming season, beginning with a doubleheader on the cricket field diamond on May 30th. It is probable that the games will be played on Wednesdays and Saturdays thereafter.

The following teams in the league representing the following units: G.W.V.A., Army and Navy Veterans, Vocational School, Queen's Science, District Depot, C.G.R. and the 21st Battalion Club.

Some amendments to the rules governing the league were suggested, but action was deferred until next meeting of the executive, when it is hoped more representatives will be present.

Progress has been made in the formation of some of the teams already, but seven teams are included in the league—the Langemarck Rangers, A.A. and N. Veterans, the 21st Battalion Club, G.W.V.A., Vocational School, C.G.R., R.C.H.A. and the R.M.C.

The executive committee will meet on Friday of next week to draw up the schedule, which will begin on June 1st. There will be two games a week and they will be played under the English Association rules.

George Young, secretary of the Military "Y," announced that good progress is being made with the organization of the G.W.V.A. leagues in Belleville, Brockville and other outside points.
