MARKET PRICES LOWER.

Butter and Potatoes Showed a Drop On Saturday.

The inclement weather kept many farmers away from the market on Saturday morning, and the attendance was the smallest for some weeks. Prices showed a tendency to drop. Butter showed a further decrease of a few cents and sold at 53 to 55 cents a pound, but eggs sold at 50 cents a dozen. A few fowls were on hand and the prices were from \$1.75 to \$2.50. Yeast brought 16 and 17 cents a pound for forequarters and 21 and 22 cents a pound for hindquarters. Potatoes showed a substantial drop in price, the most being sold at \$1.25 a bag.
