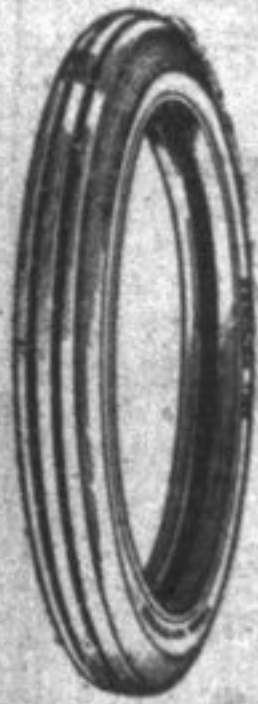

## NO REDUCTION IN CHARGE DAUGHTER ALWAYS TIRED

FOR WATER SERVICE TO HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION.

The Utilities Commission Says No Emphatically—Cost of Making Changes in the Street Lighting System.

Manager Folger reported to the Utilities Commission yesterday afternoon that it would cost \$6,676 to install the additional street lights asked for by the Fire and Light Committee. This committee wants to cut out twenty-three of the "white way" lights and four arc lamps, and add fourteen arcs and thirty-four tungsten lamps. There would be an additional cost of \$798 a year for the charges. These figures will be presented to the Fire and Light Committee and if the City Council adopts the committee's recommendation, the utilities manager will proceed with the changes.

The Hydro-Electric Commission asked the local commission for a reduction of its water charges. This request nearly caused a riot. "Nothing doing," the commissioners declared. Why? Well, if the Hydro-Electric Commission is given a water rate of seven cents for a thousand gallons in western places, as compared with ten cents in Kingston, it is because the Hydro Commission charges Kingston fifty per cent. more than the aforesaid western places for power.

The manager was requested to make a report on the cost of removing the electric poles on Princess street, between Barrie and Division streets, and placing the wires underground; also of replacing the present poles with more ornamental ones. The city engineer wrote asking that the commission remove its poles if possible, as this roadway was to be paved shortly.

It was announced that the old direct current generator at the plant had been sold to the Canada Pipe and Steel Company. The commission will receive \$2,300 as the result of the sale, a good figure.

Chairman Elliott reported that, according to authority granted him, he had sold the two houses on Barwick street owned by the commission to James Rankin for \$382. The latter is to remove them from the island.

A report was received from Engineer Evans stating that the chlorination plant at the waterworks was giving satisfaction. For the past three weeks no contamination had been reported in the water supply. The commission decided to ask Queen's laboratory officials for daily reports and to pay whatever they asked for them, as it is desirable that the commission know exactly how the water tests each day.

The amount of Hydro-Electric Commission for power during April was \$2,967.

In attendance at the meeting were R. F. Elliott (chairman), Mayor Newman, Thomas Hewitt and T. J. Rigney.

**TIPS FOR SICK SOLDIERS.**

The Citizens Asked to Take Them in Their Cars.

Convalescent soldiers in the military hospitals are unable to get the benefits of excursion trips on the river and through the islands, formerly enjoyed by the citizens of Kingston before the war, because no regular boats ply on the route. The steamer Brockville, which will make occasional trips, cannot afford the opportunity the soldiers should have for recreation.

This loss can only be made up by the generosity of citizens who are willing to use their automobiles to give the boys rides into the country. To realize what it means to these men—some of whom have been in the hospitals for two and three years—to get out and see the blue sky, to hear the fresh breezes laden with the scent of spring flowers, is to respond in the most generous manner possible.

The citizens of Kingston have never failed to do what they were needed for the welfare of the soldiers while they were overseas, and it is felt by those who are doing their best to fan the spark of vitality into the glow of health and vigor, that more is required than nursing and medicine. The long hours of monotony, the monotony of the daily routine and the narrow horizon cause undue introspection which is harmful to the individual and retard progress toward recovery. Nobody knows this better than the doctor, the chaplain and the nurse. The patient looks forward to any little break and halts a ride in an automobile or a trip in a motor boat as a God-send.

For these reasons Capt. McNabb is energetic in his efforts to provide the necessary motor boats for the summer, but as their use will depend upon the conditions of the weather, no fine day should be allowed to pass without some boys getting the benefit of it.
