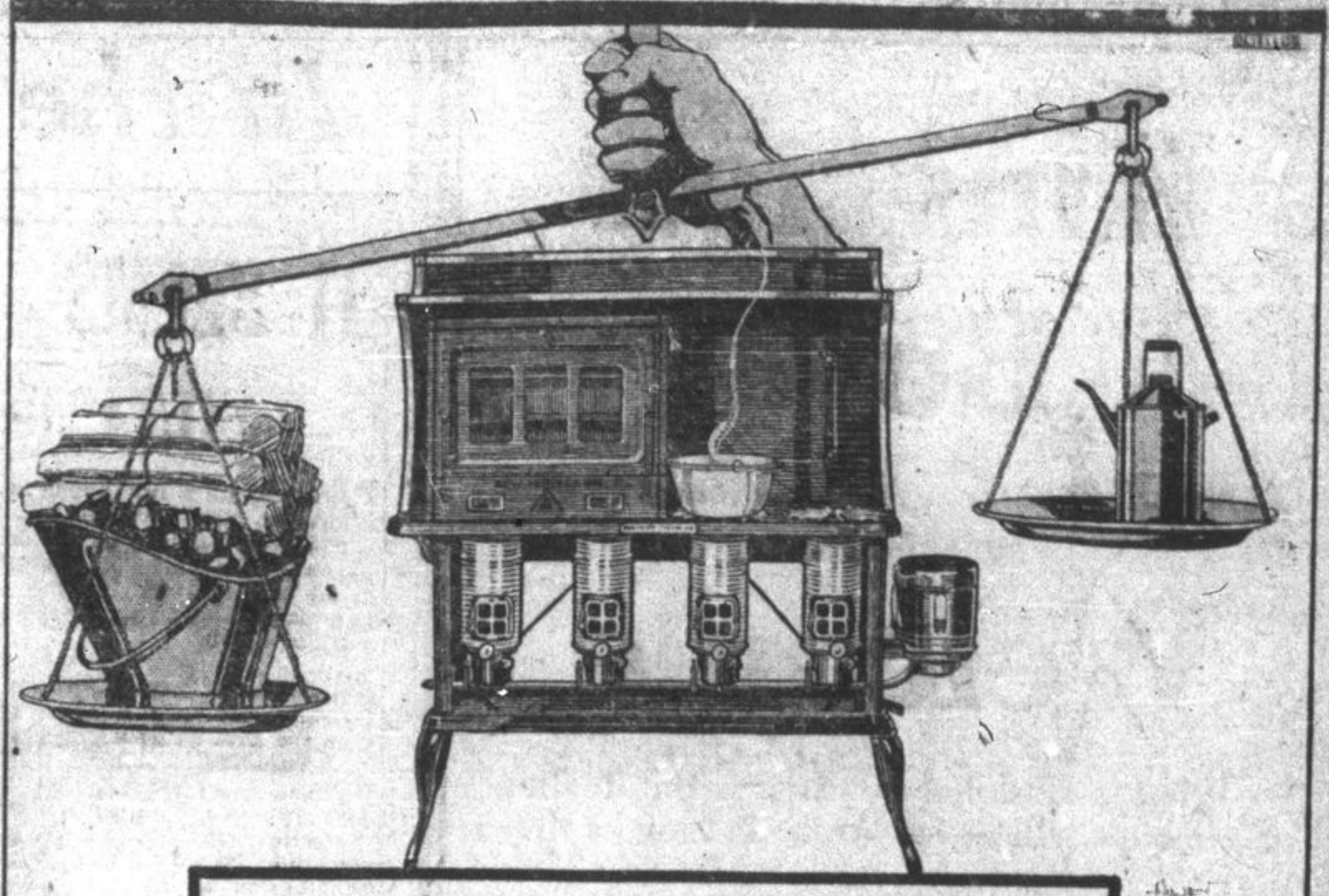
THE G.W.V.A. CONVENTION

That all conscientious objectors and defaulters under the Military Service Act be disfranchised (unanimous). Trenton Soldiers "Ringed." Trenton, May 20.—Thirty signet rings have been presented to Trenton soldiers who have returned from the war, and to mothers of men who will not return. The work will be continued until every returned Trentonian is similarly honored.

William Watchorn has been appointed town constable and enforcer of by-laws by the Almonte council and will shortly begin his work as sanitary inspector.

On Saturday Stanley Fitcherott, Pittston, died suddenly. He was at Spencerville earlier in the day and shortly after returning home went into a field and immediately passed away. He had been subject to heart trouble. Deceased was thirty-five years of age.

Mrs. Jane Caskey, widow of the late Robert Caskey, died at Belleville on Sunday. Deceased was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert Johnson, Hungerford township, where she was born and resided nearly all her life.

London City Council agreed to allow the street railway company to charge five cents straight fare on Sunday, and Windsor Council passed a by-law for the citizens to vote on on June 14th, granting a five-cent fare on the S. W. & A. Railway.

Flight Lieutenant Home. Belleville, May 20.—Flight-Lieut. Ted Yeomans, son of Dr. Yeomans, medical health officer of this city, arrived home Saturday and was accorded a hearty welcome. He served in the Canadian Field Artillery and in the air service, and was awarded the military medal for bravery. He spent over a year in Germany as a prisoner of war.
