## FISTIC FANS TO LIVE ON TRAINS AT BOAT

Expected That Over Seventy Thousand Will Attend Big Fight at Toledo.

Representatives of twenty-seven railroads, twelve electric railways and three steamship companies are working out transportation problems incident to handling the 60,000 or 75,000 persons expected for the Jess Willard-Jack Dempsey championship fight July 4th, at Toledo, Ohio.

Facing the greatest transportation problem in the history of the city these men will endeavor to agree upon a schedule that will bring the visitors here and out again in a minimum of time and without confusion.

It was announced that no trains would be given from any point, and that the trains would depart from the point where they are parked upon arrival. It will be announced to the passengers that the train upon which they arrived will leave at a designated hour from the point where it is put upon a side track. Every track in the terminal at Union Station will be cleared for use of these special trains. It may be that passengers will be permitted to occupy berths during the time they are here.

David F. Fitzgerald, an alderman and ring official of New Haven, Conn., to impress upon Tex Rickard his qualifications as referee of the Jess Willard-Jack Dempsey, heavyweight championship battle here on July 4th. He is the first candidate for the position to reach the battleground.

Fitzgerald, a six-footer of 200 pounds, is a ring official of 20 years' experience. He has refereed all of the important ring battles decided in Connecticut and has given decisions at the finish of all of them, which will be required here Independence Day if Willard and Dempsey are on their feet at the end of the twelfth round. He refereed a contest in which Willard was engaged before he became champion.

Dempsey is nicely settled in his training camp at Maumee Bay and ready to begin the serious work of his conditioning grind. Jimmy DeForest, of Long Branch, N.J., a veteran boxer and trainer, arrived today to assume charge of the challenger's work. DeForest has supervised Dempsey's conditioning for several matches. Before the end of the week a half-dozen sparring partners will be on the job.

Montreal has another fight fiasco Monday night. Referee Lapage stopped the Brosseau-Ferguson bout in the third round and awarded it to Brosseau, claiming Ferguson had fouled the Montreal boy. Brosseau had not made a claim of foul, and Lapage's decision came as a great surprise.

## About Boxing Titles

Quite a bit of reminiscing of the loss of boxing titles by referees' decisions in bouts that went the limit is being done these days. It is contended by some that it would not be fair to Jess Willard to take his title away in a decision at the end of twelve rounds unless he was beaten very badly.

Jack Keenan had something to say about that short time ago in the most interesting comment. "I am sending Jack Dempsey into this battle to win the world's championship, and I believe he can do it with a decision on points if he doesn't knock Willard out in the limit," said Dempsey's manager. "Of course I believe Jack will win with a quick knockout. But you can bet your last nickel that I will never agree to let Dempsey go into the ring with a referee who is likely to have pity on Willard and call the bout a draw if Willard isn't beaten."

There is a lot of sentimental twaddle spread around a champion. If he isn't whipped to a frazzle, as a rule, referees try to "protect" his title. But there is the recollection of Johnny Kilbane's twenty-round victory over Abe Attell when he won his championship, and Freddie Welsh's triumph over Willie Ritchie. Those bouts apparently were settled on their merits and championships changed hands without knockouts.
