

ASK RECONSIDERATION.

the Peace Pact—Declare. It Breach of Faith. London, May 26 .- An appeal signed by a number of eminent professors and others, including the Bishop of Oxford, Arthur Henderson, leader of the labor party in the House of Commons, and H. G. Wells, John Mazefield, Lady Gilbert, George G. Murray and Jerome K. Jerome, authors, has been published here, urging the reconsideration of the terms of peace on the ground that they belie the spirit of the fourteen points of President Wilson. The appeal declares that the terms constitute a breach of faith with a beaten enemy and reduce Germany to the position of a subject nation.

It concluded with a statement that on such a basis "it is impossible to establish any true league of nations."
