COMMONS CARRIES MOWAT MOTIONS

Aids Municipal Ownership And Champions Municipal Rights.

CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY

MUST BE SECURED FOR USE OF STREETS.

Cabinet Ministers Voted Against the Amendments of Mr. Mowat—Railway Commission Employees Under Civil Service Commission.

Ottawa, June 5.—At an early hour this morning, the House of Commons gave its aid to municipal ownership and championed municipal rights by carrying the Mowat amendment to the consolidated railway bill by the close vote of 66 to 52.

Mr. Mowat (Toronto) then moved another amendment that any company purchasing Toronto Electric Light Company be bound by the same provision.

A motion by Hon. Dr. Reid to bring employees of the railway commission under the civil service commission was carried unanimously.
