RAIN WAS WELCOMED BY DISTRICT FARMERS

Roots Were Beginning to Dry Up, Owing to Intense Heat.

The heavy rain on Wednesday night was a welcome boon to farmers in the district. For weeks past there has been insufficient moisture and in some places the growth of the crops has been retarded considerably. The sun has been so hot that it has baked the roots in the ground and apprehension was felt as to the success of the crops in the district. However, the rains will improve conditions considerably and still more will be welcome.

Reports from the countryside state that the hay crop has been a great success. Early in the season the fields were flooded with rains and the grass received a great start. Following this was a period of drought and ideal conditions for haymaking were present.

Incidentally, considerable quantities of hay have been garnered in the city in vacant fields. The property belonging to Queen's University as well as the Cricket Field have yielded considerable hay as well as many other smaller pieces of ground.

TO ASK FOR DEPUTATION.

From Board of Education to Wait Upon City Finance.

A meeting of the civic finance committee was held on Thursday morning to consider the request of the Board of Education for the raising by debentures of \$135,000 for the erection of a new public school. The feeling of the committee members was against the building of a school at the present time owing to the high cost, but it was decided to ask the Board of Education to appoint a deputation to confer with the finance committee next Monday evening. One of the finance members stated that if the school by-law was submitted to a by-law he submitted at the same time for the abolition of the Utilities Commission, in so far as it has to do with the water-works.
