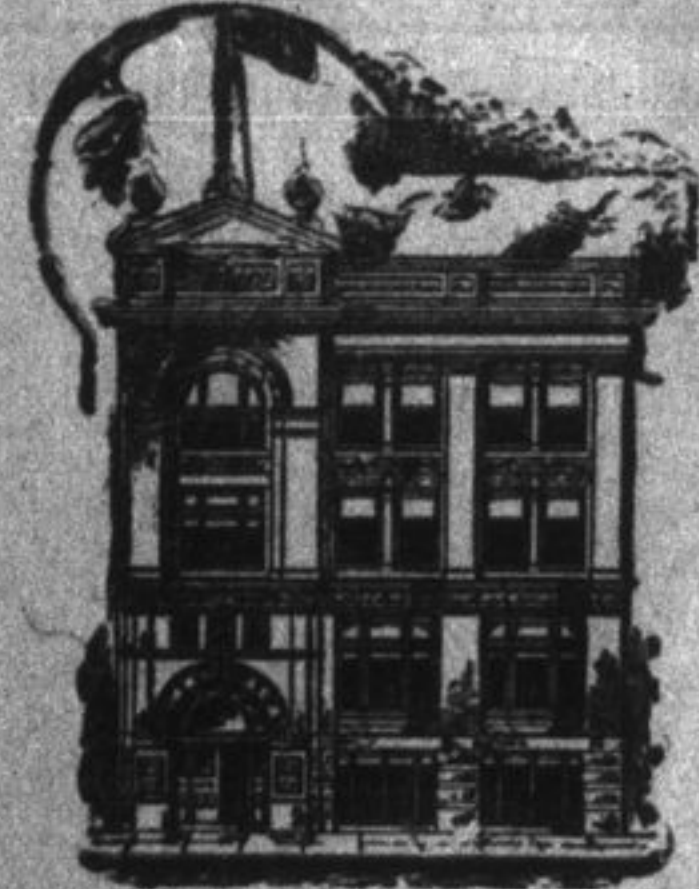

Massacre of Cawnpore, June 26th, 1857. On the wall of a well in Cawnpore a city of the province of Allahabad in India, is graven the following inscription.

An Empire Calendar

Sacred to the perpetual memory of a great company of Christian people, chiefly women and children, who near this spot were cruelly murdered by the followers of the rebel Nana Dhuunda Pant of Bithur and cast, the dying with Dead into the well below.

This inscription marks the site of one of the most horrible and gruesome massacres in the world's history. When the mutiny broke out, Cawnpore, was under the command of Sir Hugh Wheeler, an efficient and experienced officer.
