FROCKS OF YOUTHFUL SIMPLICITY.

Designed to give the figure slender, youthful lines is the dress to the left, in figured voile. It is trimmed with fancy ribbon and plain organza, the two trimmings being combined effectively on the belt, sleeves and collar. Medium size requires 3 3/4 yards 48-inch voile, with 4 yards narrow ribbon and 1/2 yard 40-inch organza.

Plain gingham taffeta and challis in plain color are used together in the second frock, which has the front panel and shoulder yoke cut in one. Cut on the bias are the two folds of taffeta which form the flare cuffs of the long, narrow sleeves. The shawl collar is of challis. Medium size requires 1 3/4 yards 40-inch taffeta and 5 yards 40-inch challis.

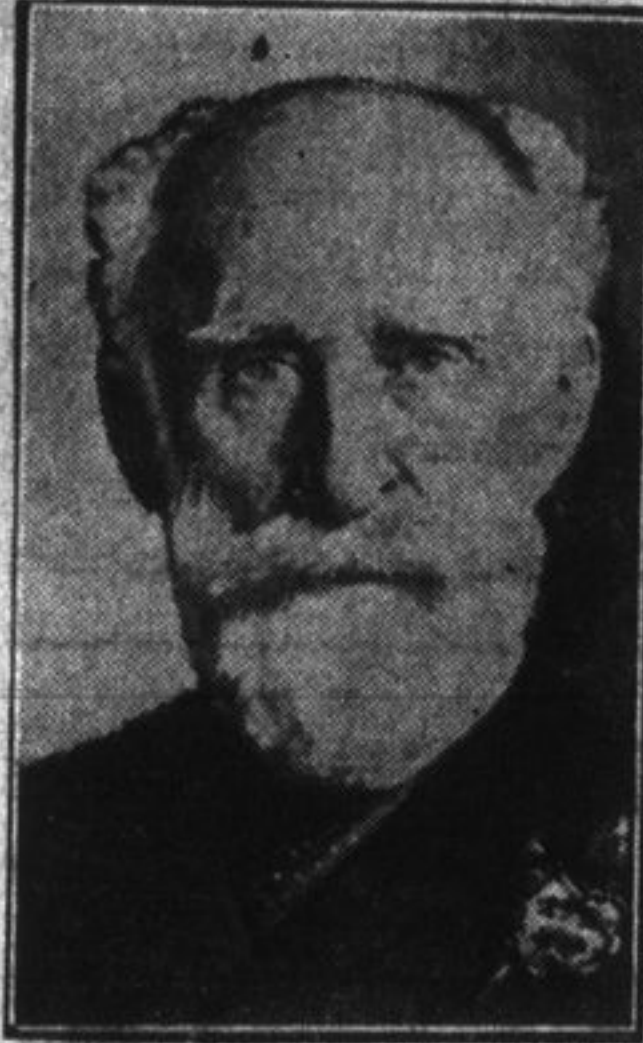

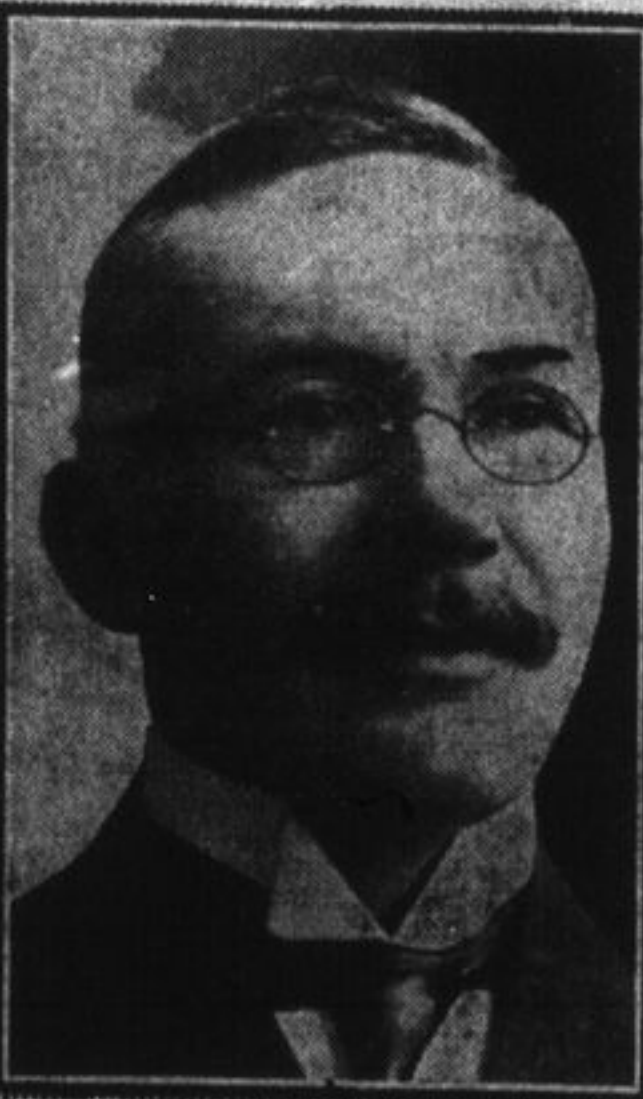
A Column Of Notables.

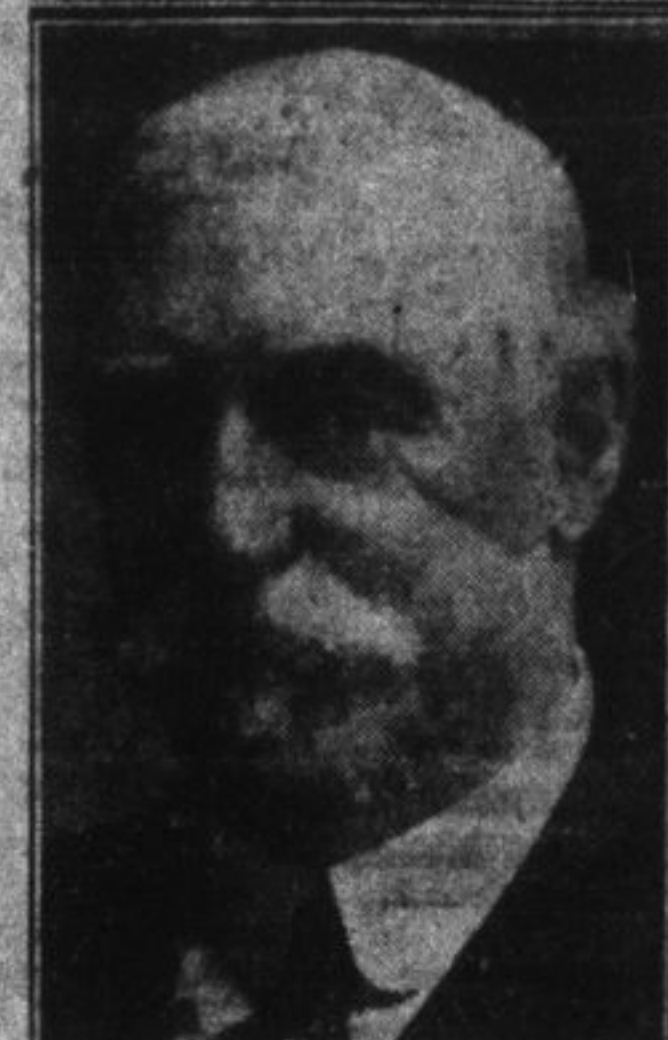


HON. ARTHUR MCPHERSON. Who is credited with originating and carrying out the Winnipeg coup, by which ten strike leaders were arrested.

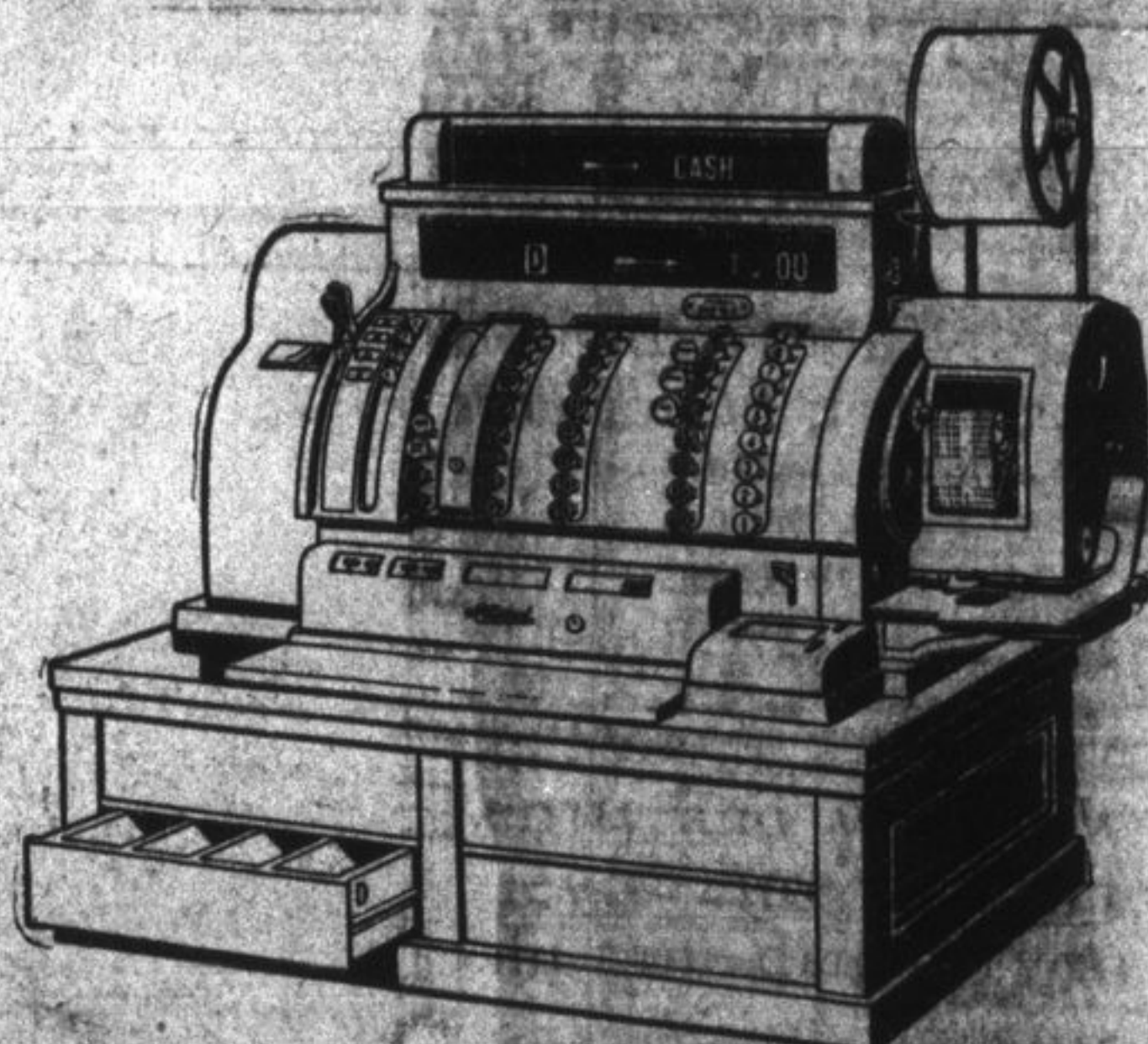
