

Watering Farm Horses.

"It is a common thing for farmers to work their horses in the hay-field from morning to night, walling them only at noon. This as done even on days of excessive heat. The driver usually has two or more refreshing drinks in the middle of the morning, and again in the afternoon; but the horses, who are equally as thirsty, go without. This want of water is not only distressing, but it causes the horses to drink to excess at noon and again at night, which often results in colic, and always tends to produce a distended stomach, or what farmers call a "hay belly."
